The new Student Success requirements recently adopted into law by the state of California require that all new students MUST have completed orientation, assessment and education planning before receiving priority registration at a California Community College. This law goes into effect with the start of the summer/fall 2014 priority registration cycle, which formally begins for Solano Community College in March of 2014. To prepare new students SCC is offering the following services:

**1. Orientation/Information Workshops**: 3 hour, evening sessions; 2 to 4 times per month throughout spring at our Fairfield campus, Vacaville and Vallejo centers. Students will complete Applications for Admission and will be current for admission through Fall 2014. Topics covered:

- **2. Assessment:** Offering assessment testing various days, evenings and weekends throughout the spring term. Students are encouraged to participate in an above referenced orientation to ensure they are well prepared for the assessment test. The Assessment Center accommodates 20 students at once, please encourage students to sign up in advance to ensure a spot via www.solano.edu/assessment/
- **3. Counseling 101:** During orientation students will be encouraged to complete a one half unit (.5), 8 hour course offered by the counseling department. This course will cover essential information for students about college, success strategies, scheduling, and ideas about how to choose a major. The major emphasis in this class will be the development of a comprehensive Student Education Plan. The course will be offered several times throughout the months of February and March in various formats. It will be available as either a late afternoon/evening course on Mondays/Wednesdays or Tuesday/Thursdays for 4 hours each session, or an all day 8 hour class on a Saturday.

The ideal pattern will be for students to complete the orientation and assessment then participate in the COUN 101 course, where they will develop their education plan. This schedule will allow students to meet all requirements in time to benefit from priority registration for summer/fall 2014 sessions.
