The 2019 Strategic Plan goes to the Board for review 5/1, and for vote 5/15. The plan integrates the systemwide vision for success goals. Feedback and input on the **attached draft** are welcome.

eLumen Presentation

Two representatives from eLumen attended the Senate meeting to present highlights and answer questions. From their presentation:

- Over 51 CA community colleges use eLumen, most joining on in the last 5 years.
- Migration from meta to eLumen may be tricky. Additional Assessment method options and rubrics make it hard to migrate the data. Previous years' assessments won't migrate as data, but as PDFs
- Migration time: 3 months average w/ faculty participation.
- "Fully integrates with Canvas."

Demo included: banner integration at course level, shared rubrics, personalization options, labor market integration, program review data connection, etc. Other features touched on included: SLO performance by ethnicity, course CoR comparision charts, stackable credentials and pathways program handling in their curriculum area.

\$24k annual for curriculum and e-catalog components

\$25K one time cost for one year of implementation year help
