PUBLIC COMMENTS

A/S PRESIDENT'S UPDATE

- Hybrid Spring plenary (4/7-4/9) please let Christina and LaNae know if you'd like to attend by 2/21
- Survey results (In-person/hybrid/remote senate meeting): Of 19 responses, 13 voted for virtual and 6 voted for hybrid
- Black History Month: PTK noticed that on-campus BHM events are taking place but aren't
 as well attended as they could be. PTK has decided to support these events by
 committing to attendance and bringing guests, while advertising through PTK channels.
 Senators are asked to lend support to maximize engagement in these events by
 committing attendance to 1-2 events and inviting a colleague. See the attached flyer for
 calendar of events if you would like to join Senate and/or advertise to your students.
 Discussion ensued re: using text messaging to reach students more frequently for campus
 activities.
- Update on Taskforces:
 - Teaching & Learning taskforce: a survey will be sent out the week of February 21st re: TLC; once that data is collected, a group will be formed to move forward on this topic
 - Student involvement in faculty hiring: will be discussed later in the meeting
 - Hiring prioritization process: this group will meet in March
 - ASTC taskforce: meeting soon re: tutor training
 - Fundraising Campaign: will be meeting soon (Senate funds for matching scholarships)
 - Welcome Back/Campus culture workgroup: Recently met with Dean Reeve and
 reviewed success/persistence data for in-person vs. online students before/during
 COVID, disaggregating the data for DI populations. We also determined a set of
 follow-up questions we would like to pursue in regards to affected populations,
 looking at how we can implement services to support them better moving forward in
 the current environment. The Taskforce plans to share the data with the Senate once
 we get it in March.
- Update on current faculty interview committees: proceeding as they were; adding deans may be addressed later, per process.
- Welcome Back Activities: Feb 22nd 9-10:30 am .Welcome table will be present but still
 needs volunteers. Setup begins at 8:30 am. Volunteers are also needed to tear down old
 signage, put up new signage, and create new signage. "Deans and Donuts" will integrate
 in to the welcome activities as well. Any/all are invited to help out at the welcome
 table(s).
