## February 28, 2022 MEETING

#### **PUBLIC COMMENTS**

Andrew Wesley: Some faculty on a Peer Evaluation panel noticed that some student surveys are distributed without addressing all modalities of instruction delivery (online, etc). The panel also wanted to know how faculty can have easier to understand and easier to access data about their classes.

These points should be brought up with the Union, as they work with administration to come up with surveys that go out to students for faculty evaluations. (And isn't Melissa giving a flex next week on the data doohickey and how it works?) I didn't see this on the schedule, but it would be perfect timing.

An Adjunct Faculty Handbook is needed. Dean Glines offered to serve on a workgroup for that project.

- Update on Taskforces:
  - Student Involvement in Faculty Interview Process: In order to implement now, we are trying a pre-pilot approach. The goal is to have 1-2 students at each first interview; the same student does not need to attend each candidate's interview but must be currently enrolled. Senate asks faculty to allow excused absences for these students (a Resolution requesting this is forthcoming). Students will be paid and will receive HR training. Committees will determine a student question and/or include students in asking questions. Committees can recruit their own students or recruit from some pre-selected pools (A2MEN, PTK, ASSC, Puente, etc.). Students will provide written feedback but will not rank candidates this time around.

## S/P ESPOSITO-NOY REPORT

- We are still waiting on the Governor's change to the COVID State of Emergency. We assume that we will be able to continue to meet remotely for some time.
- Mask mandates: this depends on details related to the pending State of Emergency and for now will continue as-is.
- S/P Esposito-Noy asked for feedback from faculty who are back to teaching on campus.
   Several senators reported that their students are very excited to be back in person.
   Feedback also included the need for more food/coffee options on campus for students.
- Many students still need flexibility of online and hybrid options for classes and services. We
  will continue to work to meet this need.
