Timely MD offers telehealth services for our students; it will be available in early May at Timelycare.com/solano and includes 24/7 no-cost virtual visits and access to scheduled counseling, TalkNow, and Basic Needs services which are student focused and managed by regionally local physicians and counselors. Available to all students except incarcerated pop and K-12/early college students.

- TalkNow: 24/7 mental health support from providers in your state. 12 per year, more can
- Basic Needs: connects students to community resources (food, housing, transportation)
- TimelyCare sessions: scheduled or on-demand classes with guided meditation, yoga, etc.

The taskforce met again since the last Senate meeting; the general feel of the group is that community repair is needed (both for students and employees) as some groups are doing fine, but others are not. Spaces that can serve in-person students need support and resources. What is Senate's roll in this support for online and face-to-face students as we move forward? Ideas include: receiving updates on unused/unallocated SEA and COVID funds and the status of the equity plan, creating non-credit workshops (ex: "How to come back to college"), and bolstering support for impacted groups. Faculty are encouraged to talk to their students and report back (to senate or senator reps): what do students need/want in order to come back and persist? A faculty survey is being developed to augment this effort.
