## How can the Academic Senate support the Vacaville and Vallejo centers? Discussion; Follow-Up; Next Steps; Possible Resolutions

Senators were asked to discuss the following questions in small groups:

- What is working at the centers? What excites you about the centers?
- What can SESC do to support the centers?
- What can we (AS) do to support the centers?

Small groups reported back that the Centers have the potential for a more close-knit and high touch feel. Ideas for support: creating thematic courses that speak to Center- specific populations, make the curriculum relevant to the career paths of the student body at each Center, make VJO a CTE hub? Questions: What can we offer as assistance to the city/residents of VJO – what do they want and need? We need to go to the communities and ask them what they want: table at parks, farmers markets, art walk, outreach in K-12 and ask kids what they want/need from the college.

## Minority Coalition – Shanan Danley

Shanan presented background on the Coalition and its membership, with the service focus to make SCC more equitable. Faculty are welcome to reach out to Shanan to get involved with the Coalition and its activities.

#### SESC - Michael Silva

#### Guided Pathways - Melissa Reeve

Planning has begun for the GP August 9<sup>th</sup> Welcome Day which is open to all students (promoted to incoming) to get acclimated to campus and aware of GP, student support services, etc. The committee needs help with planning and presentations at the event; the next meeting will be

Friday 4/7 at 9am. Guided pathways coordination positions are terming out, some are retiring; do we want to continue with GP faculty coordinators? Promoting programs/outreach/inreach is the focus now. A Guided Pathways workplan is due June 1 to the Chancellor's Office.
