





Mathematics and Science Project: Assessment Tool for Chem 010 and Chem 001 (2.1 Support Underprepared Students)

Incomplete

Both Chem 010 and Chem 001 have a high drop rate (as high as 50%). Usually this is due to students not being prepared for the level of math and/or chemistry they are expected to know at the beginning of the course. Currently, the only prerequisites for these courses are a math course and a previous chemistry class. However, there is no time limit on how long ago the math and/or chemistry class were taken, nor the level of difficulty or depth of knowledge of the previous chemistry course. Thus, the chemistry faculty will develop an assessment tool for students planning to enroll in Chem 010 and Chem 001. This guidance tool will help the counseling office place the students in the appropriate chemistry class.



The chemistry department has several chemistry tutorial programs that are installed on the computers in the chemistry laboratories at the main campus. However, students do not have access to these programs outside of class. Also, chemistry students often need a quiet place to study, to work with their lab groups or a place to do their chemistry online homework. Many students desire to use the chemistry tutorials and need a place to work together to develop a community or study group which will help them to succeed. To help students achieve access to reliable computers and the chemistry tutorials and software, the chemistry faculty will develop resources and funding to allow faculty to facilitate "open lab" hours so that students can access the computers in the chemistry laboratories when the labs are not in use for a class and to provide a quiet place to study and do homework. They will also work with IT to install these programs on the computers at the library and the Academic Success Center and both the Vacaville and Vallejo centers.

Furthermore, the chemistry software is becoming outdated and is no longer supported. Chemistry faculty will research other possible chemistry tutorial software programs.





Role of Our Default Prevention Task Force

As mentioned above, our task force will perform an executive and management function in the default prevention process, from creating the default prevention plan to monitoring results and making changes as necessary in the future. Here are the responsibilities of our task force:

- The task force has conducted an analysis to determine who is defaulting, and why.
- The task force has created, from this analysis, a set of measureable interventions/steps that address the results of the foregoing analysis (i.e., risk that comes from poor educational outcomes, poor employment outcomes and/or poor repayment outcomes)
- The task force has created a set of strategies to execute these steps, assigning responsibility for carrying out these steps; establishing a set of measures to determine the effectiveness of these efforts; establishing deadlines for reporting results.
- The task force will monitor and measure the results of these steps and where necessary, make adjustments so that our goals will be achieved; and
- The task force will, as it deems necessary, take other general steps to reduce both default rates and default risk among Solano Community College student borrowers.






