What does the MESA-TRIO Program provide?

Student Center

The MESA-TRIO Center is the hub of student support services for the program and the MESA -TRIO community. A computer lab with resources is available for program participants.

Counseling

All MESA-TRIO students are required to meet with a counselor twice a semester and to have a comprehensive student educational plan on file.

Academic Support

Academic Excellence Workshops (AEW's) and tutoring are offered to assist students to excel in their STEM classes.

Professional Development

Participants in the MESA-TRIO Program have access to workshops and field trips that prepare them to become STEM professionals.

University and Industry Visits

MESA-TRIO students have access to university and industry visits, allowing them to explore possibilities for their future while they are attending Solano Community College.

Financial Literacy

The program offers workshops to develop financial knowledge, including how to pay for college at the community college, and after transfer to a four year college, and how to manage a budget.

Student and Professional Organizations

Clubs associated with the MESA-TRIO program provide access to resources and conferences associated with national STEM organizations and provide a support structure.






Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible for the MESA-TRIO program, students must meet the following criteria:

- Be a citizen or legal resident of the United States.
- Students must be working towards a STEM degree, aiming to transfer to a four year institution as a STEM major, or working to attain a two year degree in a STEM field.
- Low-income (as defined by federal guidelines) and/or be a first-generation college student.
- Can not possess an AA/AS or higher degree.





MESA is the Mathematics, Engineering, Science Achievement program that is administered by the Community College of California Chancellor's Office and aims to assist students to transfer to four year universities as science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) majors. TRIO Student Support Services (SSS) STEM is a federally funded program from the United States Department of Education that supports low-income and/or first generation college students pursuing bachelor's degrees in STEM fields, thus increasing equity in higher education STEM fields for students.
