Felt that the breakouts were helpful on how to break down issues and improve upon them. Spoke in the Caucus Workshop on how to form a Caucus, there were representatives from both the Black Caucus and the LGBTQ+ Caucus.
  - c. Senator Ahmad: Felt that she really learned more about how our system works, as well as how divided our country is. Feels discouraged that the Ethnic Studies course Resolution was not passed. Thankful for our advisor. Learned more about herself, her rights, economic status, state legislation, as well as issues in our country. Did not believe that a lot of the language in the presentations did not give enough information for the body to vote, and that many of the Resolutions were written poorly. Believes that people should be knowledgeable when coming to General Assembly. Stated that it would be much more helpful to have documents with additional information for better understanding when voting. Was able to speak to many other students and share information. Brought up rewriting a Resolution and presenting it.
  - d. Vice President Potts: Stated that next semester she believes that we would be in a good position to present a Resolution.
