

HOW TO: ORDER NEW OR REPLACEMENT STUDENT ID'S

Step 1:

Make sure that your current mailing address on MySolano is correct

Step 2:

The cost of a student ID card is \$5

The payment can be made in cash, money order, check, Visa, Mastercard, and etc.

Other payments can be made through your MySolano student account

Step 3:

Make arrangements for ID photo

You can either set up an appointment by emailing the cashiers office to have your picture taken (bring payment and a form of ID)

Email the cashiers office with a picture ID in a .jpg format that is most recent and in color (this will be reviewed and added onto your ID when approved)
