III. Approval of Agenda

## IV. Approval of Minutes

# V. Public Forum

- Sandra Diehl spoke on behalf of the sustainability advisory committee. She informed the senate of the recycling awareness programs on campus (i.e., blue cans on campus) and of "recycle-mania," a competition across over 400 campuses. Solano will hold competition between clubs and building. It is 8 weeks long and has prizes yet to be determined. It is February 7<sup>th</sup>- April 3<sup>rd</sup>. The possibility of ASSC Co-sponsoring this event was brought up and proposed to be further discussed in a future meeting.
- b. Toni Murray spoke of the trouble of stepping up and filling the gap when things fall apart (student perspective) and how a song can help do this. She proposed the idea of ASSC sponsoring a track, via fundraising. Whether it be a jam, a full track, something to help students that are on the brink. Initially something that will help students decide to stay in school. \$1200 base: 12 months, 12 students, 12 songs.

- VII. Information Items
  - a. Solano Transportation Authority/Intercity Transit Consortium Philip Kamhi

Dr. Slade introduced Phillip to speak of the transportation student fee that has been in works, the history of it, who he represents, and what is being done. He is from the Solano Transportation Authority. Their partner agencies are Vacaville City Coach, Fairfield and Suisun Transit, Solano County Transit, Fairfield and Suisun Transit. The idea is that the ASSC would place a student fee of \$7-\$10 a semester that would in turn lead to the students having discounted transit fees of 50%. With a valid ID a student would be able to purchase a pass ½ off for any of the named transit partners, hopefully at the student bookstore. The offer is a 2 year pilot, to try it out, possibly bringing in more riders for the transit while also helping students with funding. If the measure is to go on the ballot the ASSC must push it to get out to the student just how important and helpful this 2 year pilot could be!

b. Change Senator Positions / Governing Board Senator

Mariah indicates she is interested in being full time secretary to fulfill the vacant secretary spot. Multiple attending students interested in opening senate positions. Matt Hartsock is interested in governing board position, which attends the Wednesday night meetings with the Board of Trustees and all of the Administration. The Governing Board takes notes from those
