ASSC Minutes November 17, 2015

- I. The meeting was called to order at 12:32pm.
- II. Official Roll Call.12 Senators present. Absentee is Social and Behavioral Sciences Zach Freeman. Quorum achieved.
- III. Career Tech moved to approve the agenda, the motion was seconded, and was passed unanimously.
- IV. Student Services moved to table the approval of the November 10th Agenda Minutes, the motion was seconded, and was passed unanimously.
- V. Public Forum
 - Toni expressed her concern about the scheduling of the interview forum of the SCC President candidates at the same time as the ASSC regular meeting. She sees this as violation of shared governance between ASSC and BOT.
 - Joy and Sara implement a book exchange for the bookstore and educate students on US National debt, credit card debt and student debt for their Sociology project.
 - John, Audrey and Mallory combat rape culture as a whole and make our campus safer. Educate students and faculty what consent is. Change the assault policy. No resources or therapists for survivors and people that had been assaulted. Dr. Slade advises that the Senate should be look into this serious matter concerning the need to provide mental health services for students.
- VI. Advisor's Report
 - Dr. Slade sworn in Jasmine McCrory as ASSC Secretary. Dr. Slade reminds everyone to attend the BOT meeting on Nov.18th, so that they can be introduced to the BOT and also, the presentation of the ASSC Budget for 2015-16 will be given that day as well. Suggest everyone to attend the Presidential Forum after the meeting. Dr. Slade reminds everyone that everyone has their own individual things to focus on and has enough on their plate already. Any co-sponsoring of an event should go through the Senate.
- VII. Information Items
 - A. Paying Poll Worker-Dr. Slade talked about the recent Spring Election and how the polling was done as well as Lida Ojo who covered 5 shifts at the Vallejo campus, so that students can vote and have the election not voided. And to be fair for working around her schedule in order to cover those 5 shifts poll work, Dr. Slade suggest we pay her a total of \$108 for the 12 overall hrs. she invested in polling.
 - B. Holiday Giving-Winter Wish Program is sponsored by the SCC Early Learning Center; ASSC plans to adopt 3 small families and would not exceed to spend \$250
 - C. Work Session-Work Meeting last Friday came up and discussed about goals; development of a strategic plan out of those goals starting next week
 - D. Thanksgiving Dinner Participation-Food Handler's Card Checkoff for people that are serving for the dinner; Thanksgiving Dinner Setup at 11am and Dinner Serving at 2pm
 - E. Coat Drive-Have a rack to hang donated coats, instead of putting it in a barrel
 - F. Run, Hide, Fight Video-Student Trustee feels that it is imperative for students to watch the video; the Chair listening from feedback mentions that many feel that they cannot take the video seriously; it's a serious situation but it is not portrayed as a serious situation; Gabe suggests shorten the video to only showcase the highlights of the video, instead of creating a scenario.

 - A. Fine & Applied Arts/Humanities-Talked about the SCC President election; possible next semester to have not classes on Friday; Chancellor to have a bill of \$120,000 for Canvas feed to allow staff

more support; issue of accreditation for adopting of baccalaureate guidelines; community colleges are changing the way they getting accredited

- B. Student Services/Diversity-Talked about the RecycleMania happening early February next year; Sustainability's big project of installing at least one or possibly two water refill stations on campus to reduce the use of water bottles and carbon print; putting more recycling bins around the campuses; main concern: Facilities not properly disposing recyclables.
