- i. **Athletics**
    1. Looking to migrate in athletics from the old website to a new website, PRESTO. Old and outdated, and must put in a work order to have any changes. It could take 30-90 days to get any changes. Website is the first image to get people in Solano Athletics, we don't want it to be sloppy and outdated. We want people to look at this and feel attracted. PRESTO is used by DVC and it is the leading provider for athletic websites used by colleges. Allows utilizing social media like Facebook and Twitter!! Run all our home-games and with PRESTO we can put those games online! PRESTO is the vehicle to provide the statistics that they have to upload, so it cuts out a step. \$3,000 and the coaches will raise \$2,000 and are asking he ASSC for a kick-start of \$1,000.

  - iii. **Human Collective Club**
    1. \$500 will cover supplies for the club, to take all the research and data and presenting the final draft at the Psychological \_\_\_\_\_. They are a newer club but have already provided the school with family day where students could bring their kids and participate in activities. **iv. MESA**

1. Active club, not just for MESA students. Hold many of their own fundraiser, like Valentine's Day grams, ST. Patrick's day fundraiser and are currently in another fundraiser. Funding for the MESA banquet, which is a celebration of STEM student transfers from the MESA club. Asking for up to \$1500 from the ASSC to help throw the banquet this year. Food will cost \$1750, Music will be \$750, decorations \$500.

**v. Cyberdynes**

**vi. VETS**

1. Help veterans work into the academic environment. Asking for funding to attend the Chico conference that will help teach things like resume and interview strategies. Also spending their fundraiser money to put up the memorial at school, so they have their hands tied with money. Only \$500 bare minimum to get the hotels and what not to get them to the conference.

**vii. AGS**

1. Honors society on campus, asking for \$1000 to help send 14 members to a statewide convention held in San Jose. Community based program that helps volunteer to help provide services to give back to the community. It's over \$3000 to pay for this, just asking for \$1000 to help them from depleting their entire savings. Have already had a successful fundraiser on pi day. Have already planned future fundraisers selling pizza and lumpia, which is looking like it will go very well. They are representing SCC and give people a better image of what SCC is. Will have a program called bridge to success, where they bridge the gap where otherwise students would fall through the cracks.

**viii. Cosplay**

1. A cosplay convention funding, they have made tons of clothes and work together to get all the supplies.
