Student ID Cards

Student ID cards are **still only \$5.00** and can be purchased online at *MySolano*. They are good for various merchant discounts, discounts at Solano College sporting events, and ASSC events. ID cards can be used to sell books back to the College Book Store, use the library and computer labs. They are required in the MAC Lab and the new Quiet Zone Study Lounge in room 1428 in the Student Union Building, 1400.

Student ID cards are **valid for 9 consecutive semesters** (including summer) or 3 academic years. They must be validated each semester at no cost. Come to Room 1425 for a new sticker for the current semester.

Bring your printed Schedule Bill (from MySolano), showing \$5 Student ID fee has been paid, and a state-issued photo ID to the ID Card Station in Room 1425 (Student Development Office)

Planned Parenthood Express Clinics We will be serving students every Wednesday from 12:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. at the Student Health Center in Room 1409. All services are confidential. Services include: birth control (Nuva ring, patch, pills), HIV screening test, STD testing, free pregnancy testing, free condoms & emergency contraception.

Tuberculin (TB) Skin Testing is offered by appointment, Mondays & Tuesdays 10:00 a.m. to noon,
Tuesday, 4:00-5:00 p.m. You must return in 48-72 hours post test to have the Tuberculin skin test read and receive your record of testing.

Health Screening exams are available at the Student Health Center for Children's Program students. Drop-in or make an appointment for your Health Screening.

Screenings/testing: Health, diabetic, vision, hearing and urine screenings, are free to students.

Medications: Free over-the-counter medications for common conditions are available free to students at the Student Health Center. Medications include: generic choices of decongestants, pain medications, cough suppressants, decongestants, lubricating eye drops, burn gel, & more.
