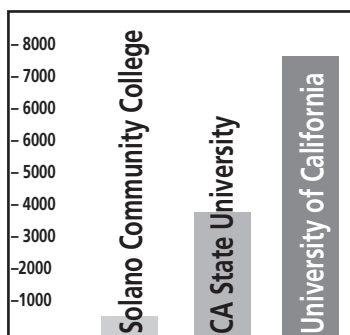

EASY Registration: WHO & HOW

Admission to Solano Community College is open to anyone who is a high school graduate, has a high school equivalency certificate, or is 18 years of age or older, and shows evidence of being able to benefit from instruction. Solano Community College also admits students in K-12 grades for educational enrichment with the approval of their school principal and parent/guardian. Important: Prerequisite Clearance. If you require a prerequisite clearance for a class in which you have a transcript from another College, please submit a request to have your transcripts evaluated for prerequisites. You can either print this form from our website and submit it via mail, fax or in person, or you can visit one of our customer service windows during business hours. Please allow 10 days before you are going to register for processing time.

What does SCC COST?

California Community Colleges are the lowest cost higher education system in California and one of the lowest in the nation. SCC students go on to four-year colleges and universities throughout the U.S., including the California State University (CSU) and University of California (UC) systems, not to mention private schools such as Stanford.

REFUND DEADLINES – Enrollment fee refunds for full semester classes will be processed automatically for classes dropped by the end of the second week of instruction. Refunds for non-resident tuition must be requested via the Office of Admissions & Records. Non-resident tuition fees are refunded according to the refund schedule in the College Catalog. All refunds are in the form of a check that will be mailed to the name and address of the student on the student account in our database.

Every effort is made to process refunds on a weekly basis. Checks are mailed shortly thereafter.

Refunds for parking decals must be requested at the Office of Admissions & Records. The parking decal must be submitted with the refund request. **If you have outstanding fees for a class that you do NOT drop by the refund deadline, you are responsible for the payment of the fees for the class.**

Cost SOLUTIONS

FINANCIAL AID

The SCC Financial Aid Office has many types of financial aid to assist qualifying students. Students may find a list of our various programs in the Programs & Services section of this schedule under Financial Aid. We are located in Student Services Bldg 400, Room 425, Fairfield campus, Monday-Thursday 8:00 am - 7:00 pm, Fridays 8:00 am - 3:00 pm; (707) 864-7103. We would be happy to assist you and answer any questions you may have.

FREE Application For Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

The 2009-2010 financial aid application priority period is January 1, 2009-March 2, 2009. Students are encouraged to apply for financial aid even after the priority filing date of March 2, 2009, but should understand that their applications will be considered late and will be processed after all priority applicants.

Step 1 To be considered for financial aid students may file a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.ed.gov each year (*Be sure to list SCC's school code: 001292*). Students may begin filing as early as January 1 each year. The sooner a student files, the sooner their eligibility will be announced. NOTE: Two weeks after students apply online (longer if paper application), they can check on their FAFSA application status and print a Student Aid Report (SAR) online at www.fafsa.ed.gov.

Step 2 The SCC Financial Aid Office receives the FAFSA application information from the Federal Department of Education. The applicant's FAFSA information is evaluated for a Board of Governor's Fee Waiver (BOGW – see Step 8). If applicants qualify for a Fee Waiver a letter of eligibility will be mailed.

Step 3 Based on the evaluation above, the SCC Financial Aid Office sends applicants a letter notifying them of any additional information and/or documents required.

Step 4 If requested, applicants must return all required documents to the SCC Financial Aid Office. All documents must be filled out clearly, completely and signed where needed. **Please Note:** At any point in the process the Department of Education may select students for a process called **verification**. If selected, we will request tax documents and other verification forms. Once all required documents are received the applicant's file is ready for review.

Step 5 Applicants' files are reviewed by the SCC Financial Aid Staff to determine eligibility. Corrections to the applicant's FAFSA will be made based on the information provided. Students will be notified if additional documents or petitions are required.

Step 6 The SCC Financial Aid Office sends applicants an Award Letter announcing how much the student is eligible to receive or a Denial Letter informing the student if they do not qualify.

Step 7 Students will receive Financial Aid checks so long as they have received an award letter, are currently enrolled, are making satisfactory academic progress and have a completed, approved file.

Step 8 Apply for a Board of Governor's Fee Waiver (BOGW). If you qualify for this program, you do not have to pay the enrollment fee for classes. This form is available online at www.solano.edu/financial_aid. See Financial Aid, page 154, under Programs and Services of this class schedule to see qualification information. Students who file a FAFSA do not need to file a separate BOGW application.

EASY Registration-SUMMER

TAKE THE ASSESSMENT TEST

You Are Exempt From the English Assessment Requirement if:

- You have earned a college degree OR
- You can produce satisfactory test scores from the following tests to waive the English assessment: A SAT Critical Reading score of at least 500, a College Entrance English Composition (ECT) of at least 600, or a CSU English Placement Test (EPT) of at least 151, ACT score of 23, English Advanced Placement (AP) with a score of 3, 4, or 5, a University's Subject A exam with satisfactory performance; or you have met the Armijo High School, Benicia High School, Dixon High School, Vacaville High School, Vallejo High School, Vanden High School, Will C. Wood High School, or the Winters High School articulation agreement with Solano Community College.

The English placement test and Math assessment test are given to students to assist in evaluating competency levels. All assessment tests are untimed and self-paced.

In order to participate in testing, **you must have your application on file with the office of admissions and records, know your Solano Community College I.D. number (SCCID), and have a photo I.D. with you** (for example, driver's license, passport, student body card, etc.).

Please note: Childcare is not available!

Approximate time needed to complete assessment tests:

English Reading & Writing & Math: 1.5 hours

Reading Only: 30-45 minutes

Ability to Benefit test: 1.5-2 hours

English as a Second Language: 1.5-2 hours

Testing is done on a drop-in basis.
