

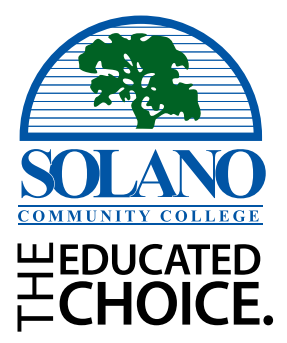

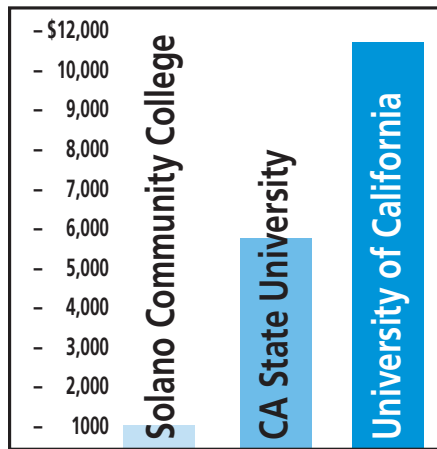

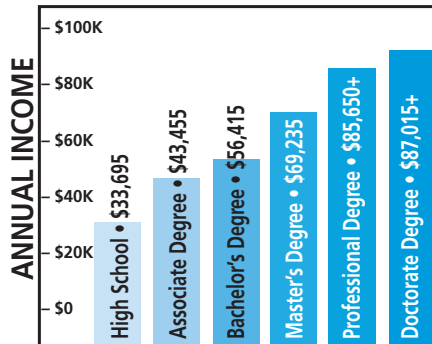
As a full-time student at Solano Community College (SCC), you can expect to pay a little more than \$1,080 in annual fees (30 units at \$46/unit). You'd pay more than \$ 5,778 a year at a California State University (CSU) campus and \$11,893 at a University of California (UC) campus. SCC offers many financial aid options and scholarships to help you maximize your financial resources.

INCREASE Your Earning Power

SCC graduates earn as much as twice the State's average wage in some cases. The average lifetime income of an SCC graduate with an associate degree is more than \$1 million—about \$250,000 more than a person with only a high school diploma. Employers also recognize the value of an SCC education. Many SCC students receive job offers immediately upon completion of our highly popular technology and healthcare career programs, for example. Associate of Arts and Science degree holders earn 22% more than those with a high school diploma.

You Have Options

Achieve Success at Solano Community College Through...

ASSOCIATE OF ARTS/ ASSOCIATE OF SCIENCE DEGREES

Students may obtain a 60-unit Associate of Arts (AA) or Associate of Science (AS) degree.

UNIVERSITY TRANSFER

Students can complete the first two years of their Bachelor’s Degree at Solano Community College, then transfer to most colleges and universities offering four-year and post-graduate degrees.

CERTIFICATE OF ACHIEVEMENT/ JOB SKILLS

Students can develop solid job skills in a variety of fields through our Certificate programs that enable them to enter the job market in two years or less.

SELF-IMPROVEMENT/ LIFE-LONG LEARNING

Students may take a wide range of classes to learn the skills and attitudes needed to be a more successful family member, skilled worker, and knowledgeable citizen.

ASSOCIATE DEGREES

The following are Associate Degree programs for students preparing to transfer to a four-year college or university and for students seeking employment in a specific career field. Students wishing to transfer should examine the Catalog of the institution they expect to transfer to and consult with a Solano Community College counselor to ensure fulfillment of lower division major and general education requirements at the university of their choice.

CERTIFICATE PROGRAMS

Certificate Programs provide instruction in the skills and knowledge needed to enter and progress in a skilled and semi-professional occupation. Students satisfactorily completing an approved program of classes as outlined below are eligible for a Certificate of Achievement. Not every class listed is offered every semester; consequently, students should review the schedule of class offerings each semester and consult with a counselor for assistance in program planning as needed.

Mandatory ONLINE VIP Orientation

Orientation is mandatory for all SCC non-exempt students before registering for classes. Exempt students are the following:

- Students who have completed an Associate Degree or higher
- Students who seek to enroll only in non-credit courses
- Students indicating an educational goal of:
 - Job Skills – to maintain current job
 - Personal Interest – not for employment
 - Complete credits for High School
 - Maintain a Certificate or License (for example, in Nursing, Real Estate)

Steps to REGISTRATION

The following activities should be done well in advance of term start date.

For Important Dates and Deadlines, go to www.solano.edu and click on “Dates and Deadlines”

Are you a **K12 student**? If so, please go to www.solano.edu, click on *Admission & Records* and then *K12 Students* for complete information specific to you.

Step 1 (Required) Complete an Admission Application online at www.solano.edu. Click on *MySolano* then *Application for Admission*.

Step 2 (Required): Obtain your username and password and SCC email address. This information will be emailed to you within 15 minutes of applying for admission. Contact Admissions & Records if you do not receive an email. Be sure to check your student email account often. Solano Community College uses email as the primary means of communicating important information to our students.

Step 3 (Required if Applicable): Submit official transcripts. If the course you wish to take has a pre-requisite, submit your transcripts from the institution where you took the course so your prerequisite can be cleared before you register. Please visit our website for an extended explanation of incoming transcript procedures. Go to www.solano.edu, click on *Admission and Records*, then click on *Transcripts*.

Step 4 (Strongly Encouraged): Apply for Financial Aid and Extended Opportunity Program and Services (EOPS). Visit our Financial Aid Office online at www.solano.edu, and then click on Financial Aid. Email FinancialAid@solano.edu, or call (707) 864-7103. You may also visit them in the Student Services Building (400). Visit the EOPS Office online also or call (707) 864-7000, ext. 4444.

Step 5 (Required in Most Cases): Take the English and Math Assessment. To take the assessment test make an appointment online at www.solano.edu/assessment/. A photo ID is required when taking the test. The results are used to help to place you in the math/English course in which you will be most successful.

Step 6 (Required in Most Cases): Complete the Online or In-Person Orientation. To complete the Online Orientation please go to www.solano.edu/orientation/. To complete the in-person Orientation please contact the Counseling department at (707) 864-7101.

Step 7 (Strongly Encouraged): Meet with a Counselor. Meet with a counselor to develop a personal education plan for achieving your goals. Make a Counseling appointment online at www.solano.edu. Click on *Counseling*, and then click *Counseling Services*. Call (707) 864-7101 for more information.

Step 8 (Required): Check your Priority.

- Check your assigned priority date and time by logging into *MySolano*
- Click on the *Student* tab
- Click on *When Can I Register?*

Step 9 (Required): Register for classes:

- Click on the *Student* tab
- Click on *Add* or *Drop Classes*
- Next select appropriate term

Step 10 (Required): Pay fees. Pay your fees online when you register.

Step 11 (Required): View/Print your Schedule Bill. Your Schedule Bill/Receipt shows the classes you are enrolled in, their locations, dates, times, deadlines and instructions contact information and fees for the term. To view and print your *Schedule Bill*, log into *MySolano* and select *Print Receipt and Schedule from the Student Links* menu.

Pasos para inscripción

Las siguientes actividades deberán ser hechas con mucho tiempo adelantado antes de llegar a la fecha limite de inicio del programa. Para importantes fechas y dias limites, vaya a www.solano.edu y presione en “Fechas y dias limites.”

Es Ud. Un estudiante del grado 12? Si lo es, por favor vaya a www.solano.edu y presione en “Admisiones y Registros” y entonces los estudiantes del Grado 12 podrán completar su información específica

❑ **Paso 1: Completar una solicitud para admisión por el internet www.solano.edu. Hacer clic en *MySolano* y luego hacer clic en *Application for Admission*.**

❑ **Paso 2: Obtenga su nombre de usuario y su clave y su correo electrónico de SCC.** Asegure revisar este correo electrónico seguido. Solano College usa correo electrónico como el principal medio de comunicación de información importante para los estudiantes.

❑ **Paso 3: Presente sus certificados oficiales** si tomo clases anteriormente que puedan usarse para satisfacer un requisito.

❑ **Paso 4: Solicite por Ayuda Financiera y por el programa de Servicios y Oportunidades Extendidos (EOPS).** Visite la Oficina de Financial Aid en www.solano.edu, luego hacer clic en Financial Aid. Por correo electrónico al FinancialAid@solano.edu. Por teléfono al (707) 864-7103. También los puede visitar en el edificio Student Services (400). Visite la oficina de EOPS o llame al (707) 864-7000 ext 4444.

❑ **Paso 5: Tome el examen para evaluar su nivel de Inglés y Matemática / Complete la orientación sobre el internet o en persona.** Revisar el horario y las fechas de exámenes en la página web www.solano.edu. Hacer clic en *Counseling*, y luego hacer clic en *Assessment*. No olvide traer una identificación con foto cuando tome el examen de evaluación.

❑ **Paso 6: Reunirse con un Consejero.** Una junta con un Consejero es para desarrollar un plan personal de educación para alcanzar sus metas. Haga su cita con un consejero en www.solano.edu. Hacer clic en *Counseling*, luego hacer clic en *Counseling Services*. Para más información llame al (707) 864-7101.

❑ **Paso 7: Registro para clases.** Para revisar su periodo de registro entre a www.solano.edu. Hacer clic en *MySolano*, luego hacer clic en *Student Tab*, luego hacer clic en *Registration Priority Status*. Para registrarse en clases hacer clic en *Add or Drop Classes*.

❑ **Paso 8: Pagar sus cuotas.** Para obtener su identificación imprima su cuenta después de haber pagado y llevar a la oficina de Student Development en el Student Center (edificio 1400), para que le tomen su foto. La tarjeta de identificación es necesaria para utilizar la biblioteca y las impresoras en el campus. What does SCC Cost?

Payment is due upon registration. Students who do not pay within ten (10) business days risk having a hold placed on their records or being dropped from all classes.

REFUND DEADLINES:

- Enrollment fee refunds for full semester classes will be processed automatically for classes dropped by the end of the second week of instruction. Refunds for nonresident tuition must be requested via the Office of Admissions & Records. All refunds are in the form of a check that will be mailed to the name and address of the student on the student account in our database.
- Every effort is made to process refunds on a weekly basis. Checks are mailed shortly thereafter.
- Refunds for parking decals must be requested at the Office of Admissions & Records. The parking decal must be submitted with the refund request. **If you have outstanding fees for a class that you do NOT drop by the refund deadline, you are responsible for the payment of the fees for the class.**

Financial Aid

The Financial Aid Office offers many types of financial aid programs: Title IV federal and state government, scholarships offered by the institution, private and non-profit foundations. Please refer to the Financial Aid homepage at www.solano.edu, click “Financial Aid” or in the “Programs and Services” section of the printed Class Schedule and Catalog for more information.

FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid): Title IV School Code 001292

The FAFSA priority and state filing period is January 1-March 2 each year. Students are encouraged to apply after the priority date of March 2. The FAFSA may be submitted late through the end of the Spring semester. Please be aware application processing may take up to 10 weeks after completing and submitting additional “Student Requirement” forms and documentation to the Financial Aid Office. **Students are encouraged to read frequent MySolano student email blasts sent from the Financial Aid Office**

Step 1:

Apply with FAFSA online at www.fafsa.gov every year beginning January 1. Check your FAFSA status online at www.fafsa.gov AND your financial aid status by logging into MySolano at www.solano.edu.

Step 2:

BOG fee waiver eligibility is evaluated from the FAFSA beginning each fall term. If eligible, fee waiver award notification will be sent to the student’s MySolano email account. The BOG fee waiver will show on the MySolano student account under “Print Schedule Bill” after the student enrolls in courses each term. *New CCCApply online BOG fee waiver application on the Financial Aid homepage www.solano.edu, Financial Aid, Fee Waiver.*

Step 3:

Check MySolano financial aid status and submit “Student Requirement” forms and documentation to the Financial Aid Office. All forms and documents must be filled out clearly, completely, signed and dated. Applicants selected for Federal verification of FAFSA data will be required to submit additional documentation to the Financial Aid Office.

Step 4:

Financial Aid staff review, process, package, and award all eligible financial aid after “Student Requirements” are submitted to the Financial Aid Office in date order received. Students are responsible for checking their MySolano financial aid status and MySolano email notifications for any changes or updated information required by FA staff. Financial Aid award disbursements are based upon “student eligibility” and “enrollment status.”

Step 5:

Maintain financial aid eligibility by meeting Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) standards and guidelines. Check your MySolano financial aid “academic progress” after grades are reported following each term. Refer to the Financial Aid webpage at www.solano.edu, click Financial Aid, then Academic Progress for specific details.

REMINDER

All official correspondence from Solano Community College is sent to your MySolano student email address only. You should not have your MySolano email forwarded to a personal account, as it could risk the security of our correspondence or block important messages from the College.

ATTENTION

It’s not too late to apply after the annual March 2 priority filing deadline. All students are encouraged to submit the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) to see if they qualify for federal grants, work-study and student loans. Title IV Federal School Code 001292.

CA DREAMACT (AB-540 students)

California Dream Act applications are available. Visit www.csac.ca.gov/dream_act.asp to submit the application to be considered for the state Cal Grant and BOG fee waivers.

Financial Aid

The BOG Fee Waiver is a state financial assistance program offered through the California Community College system. Enrollment fee(s) for qualifying students who are California residents will be waived who meet BOG FW eligibility requirements in one (1) of the three (3) ways:

BOG FEE WAIVER A:

- Be a California resident.
- Apply with the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) at www.fafsa.gov or the BOG Fee Waiver application. Refer to www.solano.edu, click “Financial Aid” then “Fee Waiver” for the **new online** CCCApply BOG fee waiver or the paper BOG fee waiver application.
- Be a recipient of CalWORKS/TANF (Temporary Assistance to Needy Families), or SSI/SSP (Supplemental Security Income/ State Supplemental Program), or General Assistance/ General Relief at the time of enrollment.
- Provide documentation of receiving CalWORKS/TANF, or SSI/SSP, or Untaxed Income Verification form of cash benefits currently received at time of enrollment.
- Documentation may include a copy of correspondence from the local office of Public Assistance which identifies the student (or family members if applicable) and indicates that a monthly payment is being awarded for the current or prior month. NEW AND RETURNING STUDENTS

Most new and returning students participate in the English Reading Comprehension, English Sentence Skills, Mathematics and/or English Second Language assessment tests. In most cases, students may test twice in 3 years.

Exceptions:

1. Students who demonstrate meeting academic pre-requisites for SCC course requirements, through official high school and/or college transcripts, may waive one or more assessment tests.
2. Recent high school graduates, who successfully completed a math course during the last semester of high school, may waive the Mathematics assessment test.

ENGLISH READING COMPREHENSIVE TEST

1. This test provides a Reading Comprehension score for Placement in a reading class.
2. Re-Test Waiting Period: 1 Week
3. A score of 95 or above satisfies the General Education Reading Course Requirement—in lieu of successfully completing *English 062: Analytical Reading*—for an AA/AS Degree

ENGLISH SENTENCE SKILLS TEST

1. This test provides a Sentence Skills score for placement in a writing class.
2. Re-Test Waiting Period: 1 Week
3. Once a student has participated in an initial writing course, the student must continue the sequence order of writing courses, from initial writing course to successfully completing *English 001: College Composition*

Math Test Levels

1. Arithmetic Test: 17 math problems
2. Elementary Algebra Test: 12 math problems
3. College Level Math: 20 math problems
4. Re-test Waiting Period: 1 Week

ENGLISH-SECOND-LANGUAGE (ESL) STUDENTS

Students learning English as a second language during childhood, adolescence or as an adult, may participate in the ESL tests for placement in SCC’s English Second Language courses. ESL students must complete all three ESL tests.

Health Fee Exemptions

Since the provision of health services is very expensive and the California Community College system does not have sufficient funds to subsidize student health services, the State legislature mandates that the burden of supporting a student health center will be shared by all Solano Community College students through a general fee, regardless of whether they utilize the health center or have their own insurance.

The following students are exempt from paying the mandatory health fee:

Students who fall within any one of the two grounds for exemption may apply for a fee waiver by submitting a written request to the Office of Student Development.

How to Read this Schedule

COURSE NUMBERING SYSTEM

The following numbering system indicates transferability, pass or no-pass status and other related information. For specific transfer information, consult a counselor and refer to the catalog of the prospective transfer institutions.

Class Numbers

001-049 - Qualify for an AA/AS Degree; transfer to the University of California system and the California State Universities system.

050-099 - Qualify for an AA/AS Degree and transfer to the California State Universities system.

100-199 - Qualify for an AA/AS Degree but, generally, do NOT transfer to four-year institutions. Some classes may be used to meet requirements in certain majors at some four-year institutions.

300-399 - Credit classes which DO NOT apply to an AA/AS Degree. Exception: One English class below English 001 which may be applied to an Associate Degree as an elective. Classes do not transfer to four-year institutions.

500-599 - Non-credit classes.

DEFINITIONS

Advisory – A class or equivalent preparation that will broaden the student's learning experience in a subsequent class.

CRN – What was previously known as a SECTION number is now known as a CRN number.

Co-Requisite – Some classes require enrollment in both the lecture and the lab, or are part of a learning community that requires enrollment in all classes within the community. Your enrollment in a class with a co-requisite is blocked until you have completed or enrolled in the co-requisite class.

Prerequisite – A class or equivalent preparation that must be completed before enrolling in another class. Your enrollment in a class with a prerequisite is blocked until the requirements of the prerequisite are satisfied.

Open Entry – Class that can be added to a program of study up to the last day to drop a full-term class.

Open Exit – Classes that can be completed by fulfilling class requirements at any time during the semester.

SCC Minimum English and Math

Standards – The minimum English standard is eligibility for enrollment in English 370; the minimum math standard is eligibility for enrollment in Math 330.

Student ID Number – We assign a unique 9-digit number to you when you apply for admission. If you attended Solano prior to Summer 2008, your Student ID Number transferred over to the new system.

Class Cancellation – The College reserves the right to cancel any class that does not meet minimum enrollment requirements or has unexpected staffing or facility situations that cannot be satisfactorily resolved. 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Online Classes

Solano Community College offers two types of Internet classes for credit: online and hybrid classes. Online classes are taught over the Internet and hybrid classes are taught partly over the Internet and partly in the classroom. These classes have regular assignment schedules and reading material and the same learning requirements as traditional classes. Participation in online sections and hybrid sections require that students have a computer with Internet access and a web browser. The individual classes will also have additional requirements such as a textbook and possibly a specific software program to be used. You might also have to come to campus for an in-person exam.

Online: These classes utilize the Internet to create an educational experience that can be completely independent of time and place. Students still purchase textbook(s) and take tests, but they do the majority of the classwork at a computer connected to the Internet. They work according to their own schedule, at home, in the office, or on open access computers on campus in the library. Course materials, the syllabus, assignments, tests, and links to other Web resources, are contained on the course site. Students communicate with their instructor, and each other, by sending and receiving email and by participating in “threaded discussions.” These are discussions that continue over time where students drop in to read the comments and to

add their own. While online classes may not be for everyone, they are well-suited to students who are self-motivated, who have access to a computer, who may have busy schedules and who may not be able to travel to campus for classes with specific meeting times.

Hybrid: These classes use a combination of the face-to-face and online formats. Some activities will be conducted in a group (traditional class) format and some activities are conducted (online). These classes offer the best of both worlds - flexibility with the online portion and the sense of being in a group with the traditional class meeting

NOTE: By law, applicants for certification must be at least 18 years of age. Students must present current Basic Life Support for Healthcare Providers course completion card at the orientation meeting in order to enroll in the course. Students will be responsible for Certified Background Checks and drug screens, purchasing EMT Uniforms, and EMT Skills Kits. Dean Authorization is required for registration once Lottery has been completed.

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Online Classes

Solano Community College offers two types of Internet classes for credit: online and hybrid classes. Online classes are taught over the Internet and hybrid classes are taught partly over the Internet and partly in the classroom. These classes have regular assignment schedules and reading material and the same learning requirements as traditional classes. Participation in online sections and hybrid sections require that students have a computer with Internet access and a web browser. The individual classes will also have additional requirements such as a textbook and possibly a specific software program to be used. You might also have to come to campus for an in-person exam.

Online: These classes utilize the Internet to create an educational experience that can be completely independent of time and place. Students still purchase textbook(s) and take tests, but they do the majority of the classwork at a computer connected to the Internet. They work according to their own schedule, at home, in the office, or on open access computers on campus in the library. Course materials, the syllabus, assignments, tests, and links to other Web resources, are contained on the course site. Students communicate with their instructor, and each other, by sending and receiving email and by participating in “threaded discussions.” These are discussions that continue over time where students drop in to read the comments and to

add their own. While online classes may not be for everyone, they are well-suited to students who are self-motivated, who have access to a computer, who may have busy schedules and who may not be able to travel to campus for classes with specific meeting times.

Hybrid: These classes use a combination of the face-to-face and online formats. Some activities will be conducted in a group (traditional class) format and some activities are conducted (online). These classes offer the best of both worlds - flexibility with the online portion and the sense of being in a group with the traditional class meeting

Students should be aware that there are inherent risks involved in any Kinesiology class. Students must notify the instructor of any medical condition they have, or have had in the past, that may impact their ability to participate in the class. Discipline Note: Intercollegiate athletics is for those students who wish to compete against other students at an advanced level of sport from other community colleges. To be eligible, student-athletes must be continuously enrolled in a minimum of 12 units during the semester of competition. For second year of competition, the student-athlete must have completed 24 units between seasons of competition with a minimum of a 2.0 grade point average.

Students will communicate effectively, which means the ability to:

A. Read – Students will be able to comprehend and interpret various types of written information: (1) expository prose and imaginative literature (including essays, short fiction and novels), (2) documentation such as manuals, reports, and graphs.

B. Write – Students demonstrate the ability to:

- Communicate thoughts, ideas, information, and messages in writing
- Compose and create documents such as manuals and graphs as well as formal academic essays, observing rules of grammar, punctuation and spelling, and using the language, style, and format appropriate to academic and professional settings
- Check, edit, and revise written work for correct information, appropriate emphasis, form, style, and grammar

C. Listen – Students will be able to receive, attend to, interpret, and respond appropriately to (1) verbal, and/or (2) nonverbal messages

D. Speak and Converse – Students have the ability to:

- Organize ideas and communicate verbal or non-verbal messages appropriate to the audience and the situation
- Participate in conversations, discussions, and group activities
- Speak clearly and ask appropriate questions

II. Critical Thinking and Information Competency

Thinking critically is characterized by the ability to perform:

A. Analysis – demonstrated by the ability to:

- Apply appropriate rules and principles to new situations

- Discover rules and apply them in the problem solving process
- Draw logical conclusions based on close observation and analysis of information
- Differentiate among facts, influences, opinions, assumptions, and conclusions

B. Computation – demonstrated by the ability to:

- Use basic numerical concepts
- Use tables, graphs, charts, and diagrams to explain concepts
- Use basic geometrical shapes

C. Research – demonstrated by the ability to:

- State a research question, problem, or issue
- Use discipline appropriate information tools to locate and retrieve relevant information efficiently
- Analyze and evaluate information for appropriateness, relevance, and accuracy
- Synthesize, evaluate, and communicate information using a variety of information technologies
- Recognize the ethical and legal issues surrounding information and information technologies
- Demonstrate understanding of academic integrity and honesty

D. Problem Solving – demonstrated by the ability to:

- Recognize whether a problem exists
- Identify components of the problem or issue
- Create a plan of action to respond to and/or resolve the issue appropriately
- Monitor, evaluate, and revise as necessary

III. Global Awareness

Students will demonstrate a measurable understanding and appreciation of the world including its:

A. Scientific Complexities – Students demonstrate an understanding of:

- The scientific method and its application in experiments
- How experiments work
- The major differences between social, natural and physical sciences

B. Social Diversity and Civics – Students demonstrate ability to:

- Communicate with people from a variety of backgrounds
- Understand different cultural beliefs and behaviors
- Recognize important social and political issues in their own community

C. Artistic Variety – Students have been exposed to:

- The visual and performing arts of one or more cultures
- Analytical techniques for understanding the meaning in the arts, and/or
- Hands-on experience with creative endeavors

IV. Personal Responsibility & Professional Development

A. Self-Management and Self-Awareness – The student is able to:

- Accurately assess his/her own knowledge, skills, and abilities
- Motivate self and set realistic short and long-term goals
- Accept that assessment is important to success
- Respond appropriately to challenging situations

B. Social and Physical Wellness – Students make an appropriate effort to:

- Manage personal health and well being
- Demonstrate appropriate social skills in group settings

C. Workplace Skills – Students understand how to:

- Be dependable, reliable, and accountable
- Meet deadlines and complete tasks

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Academic Integrity

Upon completion of Solano Community College's General Education program, a student will demonstrate competency in the following areas:

HONOR CODE

At Solano Community College, we believe that Academic Integrity is fundamental in an institution dedicated to personal development through learning, free inquiry, and the exchange of ideas. Honest work is an integral part of the learning process: it builds self esteem, knowledge, and skills. It is the responsibility of every Solano Community College student to represent work truthfully and engage honestly in all assignments.

We believe that any instance of academic dishonesty hurts the entire college community. Solano Community College defines academic dishonesty as:

- Plagiarism or knowingly or unknowingly using someone else's ideas, words, or thoughts without giving credit to the source
- Receiving or providing unauthorized assistance on assignments and/or exams
- Using unauthorized materials during an exam
- Fabrication of data or references
- Denying others access to information
- Forgery, alteration, or misuse of documents, records, or identification

Solano Community College will not tolerate Academic Dishonesty.

You are responsible for this information as well as the information available in the Student Handbook, the Schedule of Classes and the Solano Community College Catalog, which is available online at www.solano.edu.

At the heart of any institution of higher learning is the fundamental right of Academic Freedom for which Honesty and Integrity are preconditions. Academic Integrity is therefore fundamental to the Solano Community College community. Academic Integrity

is maintained only when all academic work is the product of identified individuals. Any act of Academic Dishonesty interferes with Academic Integrity and therefore the core values of this institution. All violations of Academic Integrity on the part of any member of the academic community constitute a serious offense.

Examples of Academic Dishonesty include:

Plagiarism:

Plagiarism consists of taking the exact words or the specific substance, structure or ideas of another and passing these words or ideas off as one's own in any academic exercise. The following examples are some of the many forms plagiarism may take.

1. Submitting a term paper, examination or other work written by someone else. This includes extended paraphrasing of another's work or research. This is a flagrant instance of plagiarism.
2. Failure to give appropriate credit for ideas, statements of facts, conclusions, or exact words derived by another either in the text or as a footnote.
3. Failure to use quotation marks or appropriate indents when using the exact words of another, whether it be a paragraph, a sentence or even a portion thereof.
4. Usage of any electronic media without providing proper citations, including the Internet, email, copied postings, or any other source of information available electronically.
5. The citing of a source which does not reasonably conform to these expectations, such as another plagiarized or otherwise undocumented paper or other resource.

Plagiarism can, in some cases, be a subtle issue. Any questions about what constitutes plagiarism should be discussed with the faculty member or a Solano Community College faculty librarian.

Cheating:

Cheating is the usage of unacknowledged or unauthorized notes, materials, information, calculators, electronic devices, or study aids in any academic exercise. Cheating also includes: using information from another student or student's paper; altering a graded work after it has been returned then submitting the work for re-grading without instructor permission; submitting another's work under one's own name. Students must not request others (including commercial term paper companies) to conduct research for them. Students may be restricted from leaving the classroom during an exam period.

Fabrication:

Fabrication is the falsification of any information or citation in an academic exercise. Fabrication includes presenting data not gathered in accordance with guidelines defining the appropriate methods for collecting or generating data or failing to include an accurate account of the method by which the data were generated or collected. "Invented" information may not be used in any laboratory experiment or other academic exercise without authorization from the instructor. The student must also acknowledge reliance upon the actual source from which cited information was obtained. A writer should not, for example, reproduce a quotation from a book review and indicate that the quotation was obtained from the book itself.

Academic Integrity *(continued)*

Facilitating Academic Dishonesty:

Students who knowingly or negligently allow their work to be used by other students or who otherwise aid another student in violating Academic Integrity are guilty of Academic Dishonesty even though they may not benefit directly from the violation. Facilitating Academic Dishonesty includes making one's research, notes, essays, or other work available for other students to access such as uploading one's work to the Internet or making it otherwise available.

Denying Others Access to Information:

It is a violation of Academic Integrity to deny others access to scholarly resources, or to deliberately impede the progress of another student or scholar. Examples of offenses of this type include: giving other students false or misleading information; making library material unavailable to others by stealing or defacing books or journals, or by deliberately misplacing or destroying reserve materials; or altering computer files that belong to another.

Forgery, Alteration or Misuse of Campus Documents, Records, or Identification or Knowingly Furnishing False or Incomplete Information to a Campus:

It is a violation of Academic Integrity to alter documents affecting academic records. It is also a violation to forge a signature of authorization or to falsify information on an official academic document, election form, grade report, letter of permission, petition, or any document designed to meet or exempt a student from an established College academic regulation.

Sanctions:

All violations of Academic Integrity are subject to an appropriate penalty. Violations at Solano Community College are classified into three levels according to the severity of the infraction and the discretion of the instructor and/or Vice President of Academic Affairs. For each level of violation, a corresponding set of sanctions is recommended. These sanctions are intended as general guidelines as culpability may be assessed differentially for those with more and less experience as members of the academic community. Examples are cited below for each level of violation. These examples are illustrations and are not meant to be considered all-inclusive.

Any violation of Academic Integrity which occurs within the classroom or the context of a particular class may incur Level One or Level Two sanctions at the discretion of the instructor. The instructor may also choose to refer the student to the Office of the Vice President of Academic Affairs for possible further action at the discretion of the Vice President, Academic Affairs, including Level Three sanctions.

To refer students to the Office of the Vice President of Academic Affairs, faculty may contact the Office of the Vice President of Academic Affairs directly or use the Solano Community College Academic Dishonesty Report Form.

Solano Community College is indebted to all those who have contributed their ideas.

CHILD DEVELOPMENT TRAINING CONSORTIUM

Book Loans, Honorariums, and Child Development Permit Application and Fee Assistance Program

If you are an Early Childhood Education student employed in the ECE Field and working towards obtaining, upgrading, or maintaining your Child Development Permit, you may be eligible for an honorarium of \$20 for each class you complete with a “C” or above. We also maintain a limited textbook loan program for ECE and Human Development courses. Apply early since the textbooks available for lending are on a first-come, first-serve basis. Applications for Child Development Permits are also available with application fee assistance. CHILDREN’S PROGRAMS

The Solano Community College Children’s Programs provide child care and development re services for children of student parents and from the community. The program is also the early childhood education laboratory school for students studying child development and family studies.

We are open for child care from 7:45 – 3:30 Monday through Friday, serving children between the ages of 1 and 5 in part day and full day programs. We also offer an afternoon preschool program from 1:00 – 4:00 each week day.

To place your child on the subsidized or non-subsidized child care wait list, you may come to the 200 building on the Fairfield campus to complete an application. As openings occur, we enroll from the wait list. The majority of the enrollment spaces are state or federally subsidized with no or low cost child care available to low-income families. The fees for non-subsidized child care vary according to the child’s age and hours enrolled in care.

The children’s days and hours of enrollment are based upon the parents’ school schedules and/or work hours. To support the consistency and structure that children need, we emphasize a consistent enrollment schedule for each child. We do not provide drop in child care services.

High quality, developmentally appropriate services are provided daily by well-qualified, dedicated teachers. Child development and family studies students learning to be teachers of young children work in the classrooms as well. The children receive one-on-one support through a curriculum designed to meet their developmental needs.

Alternate media is any instructional resource that has been made more accessible for students with verified visual, hearing, learning, or other disabilities. Alternate media comes in a variety of formats; print materials can be converted into Braille, large print, MP3’s, or electronic text, such as Microsoft Word or Adobe PDF files; diagrams and figures can be embossed to allow people with vision limitations to feel the tactile images; and assistance with closed captioned needs. Any student with a verified visual, hearing, learning, or other disability that prevents them from accessing instructional materials in traditional formats has the right to alternate media. After enrolling in classes, the student must meet with a counselor to verify the disability, determine the need, and authorize the use of alternate media. Then the student will meet with the alternate media support specialist to determine what materials need to be converted, the format of alternate media, and establish timelines for production. Some continuing (as well as returning) students may need to take an assessment test to meet specific class and/or program requirements – especially if you are enrolling for the first time in any English (except English 305) or English As A Second Language class. ESL assessment is recommended if your primary language is not English.

MATH ACTIVITIES CENTER

The Math Activities Center (MAC) is a math study area where registered students can get “drop-in” help with math assignments. Students will find a combination of peer tutors, staff and faculty on duty to assist them all hours the MAC is open. Instructor schedules are posted in the MAC each semester.

MESA (Mathematics Engineering Science Achievement)

The MESA program is a statewide academic program that supports economically and educationally disadvantaged students to excel in math, science or engineering related majors so students can transfer to four year universities.

The MESA model for success includes a variety of services that results in a high rate of academic achievement. Elements of the MESA model include:

- Individual Academic Plans
- Academic Excellence Workshops
- Academic and career counseling
- Collaborative learning techniques and study skills
- Clustering of students in classes to enhance collaborative study
- Field trips to industry sites and university campuses
- Leadership development and conferences

The main components of the MESA/CCCP include:

- **Student Study and Computer Lab Center**

A dedicated multipurpose space for quiet study, workshops, computer related activities, and information sharing.

- **Academic Excellence Workshops**
Students are scheduled in math and science core classes and taught to maintain high academic outcomes through facilitated group study.

- **Orientation class**

That teacher college survival skills to incoming students majoring in math, engineering and science.

- **MESA Counselor**

A dedicated MESA counselor is provided to assist students with their educational planning and goals.

- **Assistance in the transfer process**

Including field trips to universities, workshops on applications and counseling.

- **Career advising**

To introduce work options to students. Field trips, job fair information, job shadowing exercises and industry mentors are available to students.

OCCUPATIONAL EDUCATION — WORK EXPERIENCE

Earn 1 to 6 transferable units per semester for working in a paid or unpaid part-time or full-time position with a licensed business. We offer:

OCED 090: Occupational Work Experience

For those students working or volunteering in positions which are directly related to their declared major. You can earn 1 unit for each 75 hours paid or 60 hours unpaid

work per semester. Up to 6 units per semester to a total of 16 units. We offer full-semester, 12-week and 8 week sections.

OCED 091: General Work Experience

For those working or volunteering in jobs not related to their major. You can earn 1 unit for each 75 hours paid or 60 hours unpaid work per semester. Up to 4 units per semester to a total of 6 units. We offer full-semester, 12-week and 8 week sections

OCED 090 and 091 full-semester sections are online classes that involve a one time required on-campus orientation with the weekly meetings conducted in an online format. 12 and 8 week sections meet once a week for one hour. OCED 090 and 091 **may not be taken concurrently.**

SOLANO COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP FOUNDATION

The Solano College Scholarship Foundation is a non-profit corporation that awards scholarships to students at Solano Community College on the basis of their academic achievement and demonstrated potential for excellence. The Foundation is administered by a Board of Directors with representatives from the communities of Solano County.

Beginning with the three scholarships that were presented in 1974, the scholarship program has grown through the years. In the fall of 2010 over 80 awards were presented and over \$25,000 was distributed to Solano students. The goal of the Scholarship Foundation is to promote academic excellence among Solano students by recognizing and rewarding outstanding students. Almost all of the scholarships require students to have completed 24 graded units of coursework at Solano with a cumulative GPA of at least 3.30.

The Scholarship Foundation administers two scholarship programs, the General Scholastic Achievement Program and the Memorial and Special Endowments Program. Each of these scholarship has been established to honor and commemorate specific individuals or purposes. Most have designated majors and/or other specific qualifying requirements that determine eligibility for consideration.

STUDENTS HELPING STUDENTS BOOK GRANTS

Solano Community College's Students Helping Students Fund is a program designed to provide one-time only financial assistance to economically disadvantaged SCC students in the form of a book grant. Funding is provided by

students through a non-refundable optional fee of \$1, as well as through solicited annual contributions. A very limited number of book grants are distributed to eligible students at the start of the fall and spring semesters on a first-come, first-serve basis. New, first-time freshmen enrolled in six units at SCC, who meet the eligibility guidelines for an automatic Fee Waiver, are encouraged to complete a Fee Waiver application and the Students Helping Students Grant application. Applications are available in-person only from the Student Development Office at the beginning of the Spring or Fall Semester.

SCC STUDENT ID CARDS

Student ID cards are required for the Math and Computer labs and can be used to obtain a library card at the campus library. Many stores, museums, restaurants and movie theaters give discounts to student with current student ID cards. The ID station will be open Monday-Thursday 8 am-5 pm and Friday 8 am-3 pm in Room 1425. These hours may change to accommodate campus events and activities, so please check the office for more updated hours. Parking Information

PARKING PERMITS

Fall, Spring, and Summer parking permits are purchased online. Log on to My Solano and click on Student Parking.

Parking permits are not transferable from one person to another. It is against the law to alter, forge, reproduce, sell, or loan your parking permit to another person.

Parking permits are required each semester and during summer sessions. Faculty/Staff and reserved parking is enforced 7 days a week, 24 hours a day. All permits (semester and daily) must be clearly displayed. Motorcycles may park in designated motorcycle areas without cost or permits. Motorcycles parked in other areas require permits at the vehicle price.

PARKING ENFORCEMENT

Permit parking is not enforced in student/general parking lots during the first two weeks of the fall/spring semester and only during the first week of the first summer session offered (e.g., if a 10-week session is offered, the first week of that session will have a grace period. Any session beginning after the 10-week session will not have a grace period).

Thereafter, permit parking is enforced Monday-Friday, 7:00 am–10:00 pm. You must have a valid permit clearly displayed while parked on Solano Community College District property, including the Vacaville Center and the Vallejo Center. All other regulations and vehicle code violations are enforced 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Parking for students is provided in clearly designated areas. Certain parking areas are reserved for visitors, for faculty and staff who hold permanent parking permits, handicapped persons, and rideshare.

FAIRFIELD CAMPUS

Student parking is provided in Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7 (across from baseball and football stadiums).

VACAVILLE AND VALLEJO CENTERS

A parking permit is required to park at both the Vacaville Center and Vallejo Center. Parking permits are \$20 per semester and \$6 for Summer session.

DAILY PARKING PERMITS:

Daily parking permits may be purchased from the permit dispensers located in each student lot at a cost of \$1 per day (\$1 bills or coins accepted). New daily permits must be purchased each day. If the permit dispensers malfunction, notify the police in Bldg. 1800B or call (707) 864.7131. If a dispenser is out of service, purchase a permit in an adjacent lot. Daily permits are valid in student parking lots only and are interchangeable between the Fairfield campus, the Vacaville Center, and Vallejo Center.

HANDICAP PARKING

A current parking permit along with a handicap placard or plates are required to park in handicap parking. The placard/plates and parking permit must be clearly displayed.

RIDESHARE PERMITS

Rideshare permits are issued by the Student Development Office in Bldg. 1400, Room 1425. Vehicles displaying valid rideshare permits may park in the spaces reserved for rideshare participants and not in any other lots. If you do not have a rideshare permit, you may not park in the rideshare spaces. Rideshare vehicles must have 3 or more participants who each possess a current Solano student ID card (available in the Student Development Office). For more information, call (707) 864-7000 ext. 4367.

VISITOR PARKING

Limited 30-minute visitor parking is available at the Fairfield campus in Lot 1. Visitor parking is located along the white curb line on the north side of the lot. For visits longer than 30 minutes, purchase a daily permit and move your vehicle to

another stall in the parking lot. Do not park in rideshare or faculty/ staff lots. Visitor parking is not to be used by faculty, staff, or students. Visitor parking is also available at the Vacaville and Vallejo Centers.

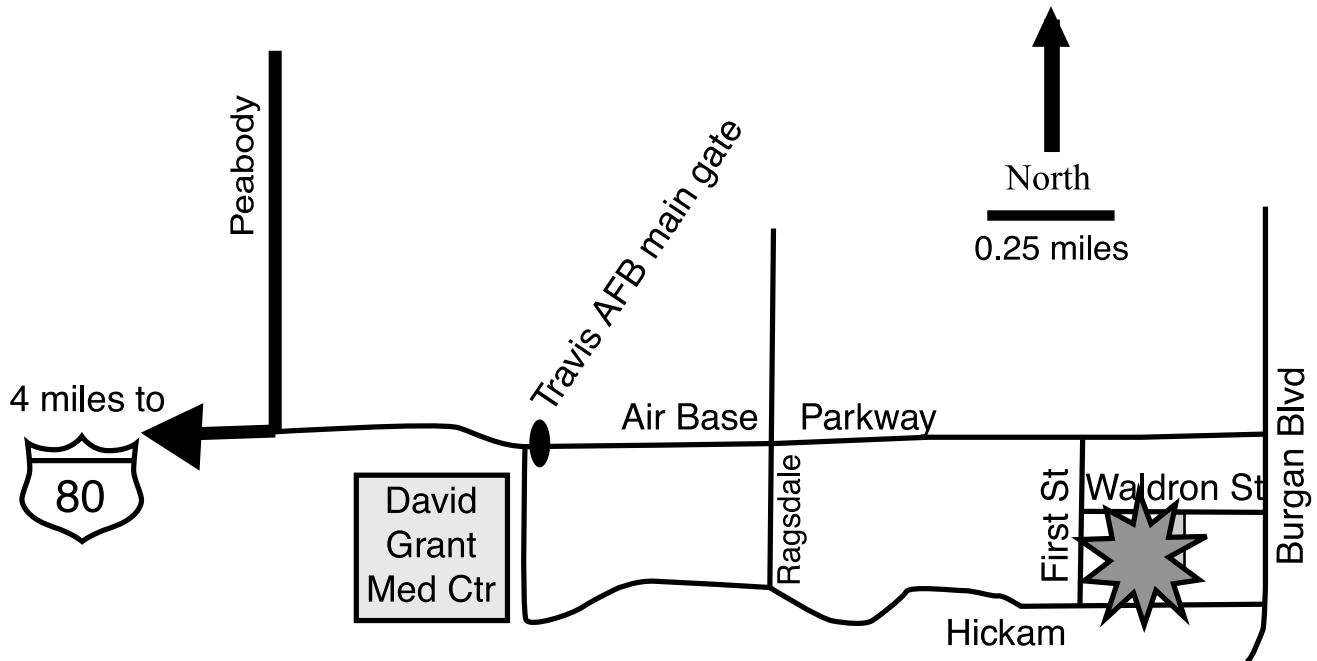

- **Childcare Parking:** 15 minutes only. For dropping off or pickup only. If longer than 15 minutes, purchase daily meter ticket and move vehicle to regular parking lot. No Faculty/ Staff or Student parking allowed.

Travis Air Force Air Base Map



The Travis AFB University Center is located in Building 249 at 530 Hickam Avenue on Travis Air Force Base. To get to the Center, take the Air Base Parkway exit off of I-80 and follow it until it ends at the Travis Main Gate. After obtaining a pass (see instructions), proceed through the Main Gate, staying on the same street. Turn right onto First Avenue, then left on Waldron Street. About half way down the length of the street, turn right into the parking lot. Drive to the back of the lot; you will see the University Center on your right. You may park in any vacant space.

TRAVIS AIR FORCE BASE GATE PROCEDURE:

Due to security measures at TAFB, all non-military students must be registered in a class meeting at Travis to receive a pass to enter the base. Students already registered for Travis classes will be able to obtain their base pass at the Visitor Control Center, 615 Airbase Parkway, Fairfield, California, located on the left hand side before the main gates.

All registered students will be required to provide the information listed below:

1. A current driver's license
2. Valid car registration (this must be the vehicle you plan to drive to class each week)
3. Valid proof of car insurance
4. Proof of your enrollment in a class at Travis (your registration printout showing your classes).
5. Travis AFB personnel may require other forms of identification as needed.

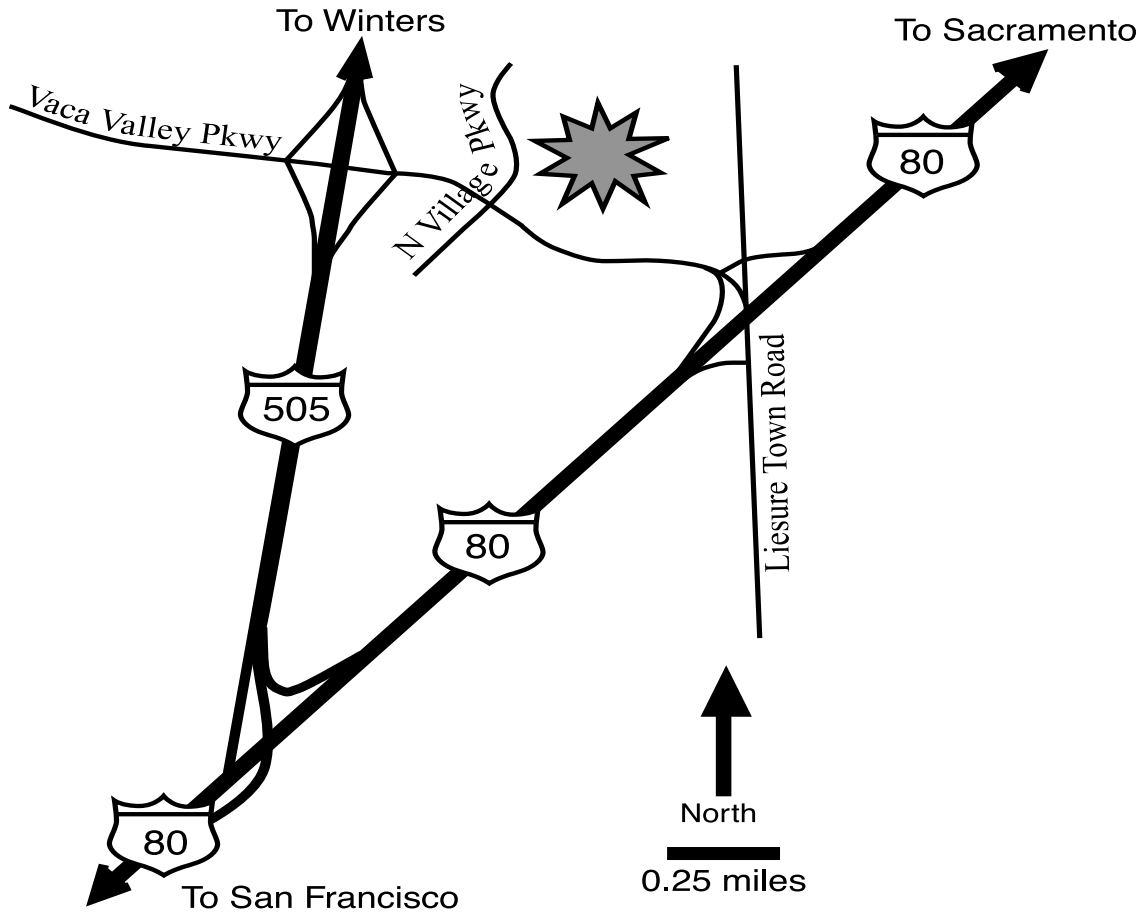
Vehicle (gate) passes are not transferable to any vehicle other than the one for which the pass was originally issued. Please allow approximately one hour for issuance of a gate pass.

NOTE: Students must have their own transportation. Automobiles without military ID, or an authorized semester pass will not be admitted on TAFB. For additional information, please call the SCC Travis office.

If you wish to add a Travis class, you must contact the instructor to obtain an "Add [Authorization] Code" and enroll in the course prior to being admitted to the Base. Once enrolled you must contact the Travis office to inform them.

DIRECTIONS FROM FAIRFIELD/VACAVILLE:

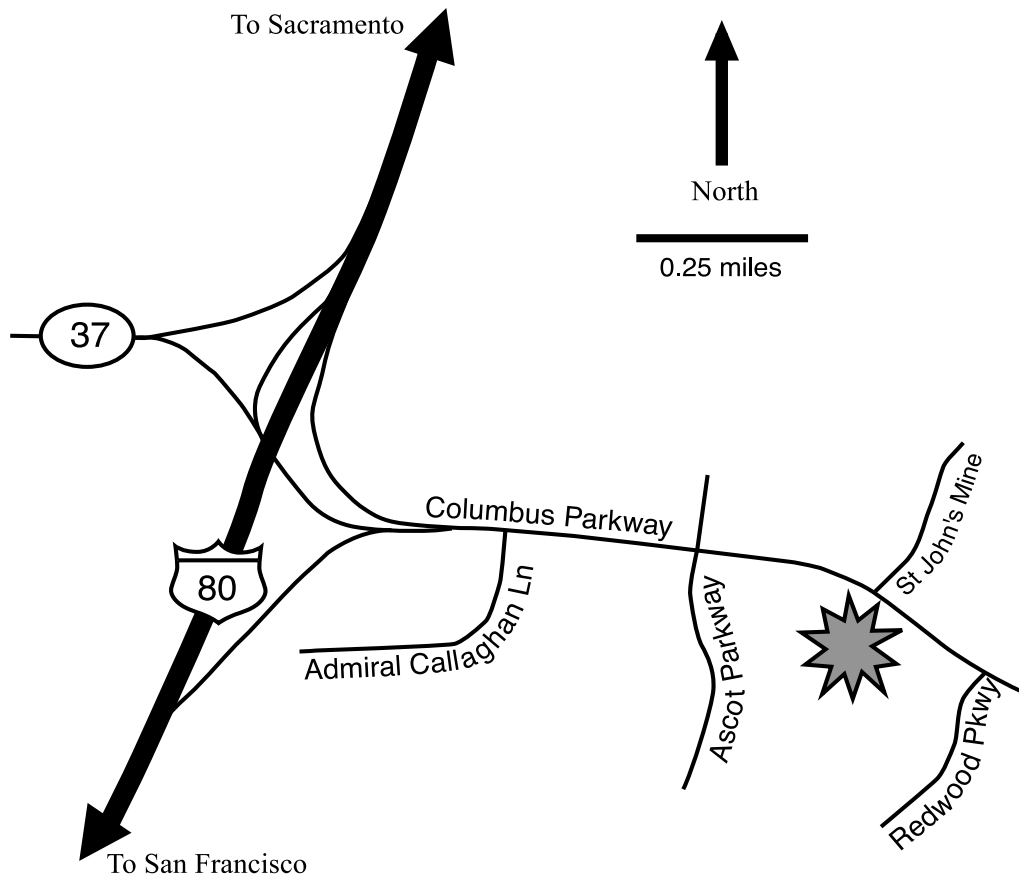

Turn left at the stoplight on to North Village Parkway; the parking lot entrance to the Center is visible on the right side of the street within a distance of 1/2 block.

DIRECTIONS FROM DAVIS/DIXON:

Take I-80 West to the Leisure Town Road exit. Turn right onto Vaca Valley Parkway. Continue straight for approximately 1/2 mile to North Village Parkway and turn right at the stoplight. Turn right into the parking lot entrance to the Center. Parking at the Vacaville Center is \$20 per vehicle. The permit is valid for the Fairfield campus and the Vallejo and Vacaville Centers. Daily parking permits are available for \$1 from the machine located in the parking lot. Daily permits are valid for the Vacaville Center only.

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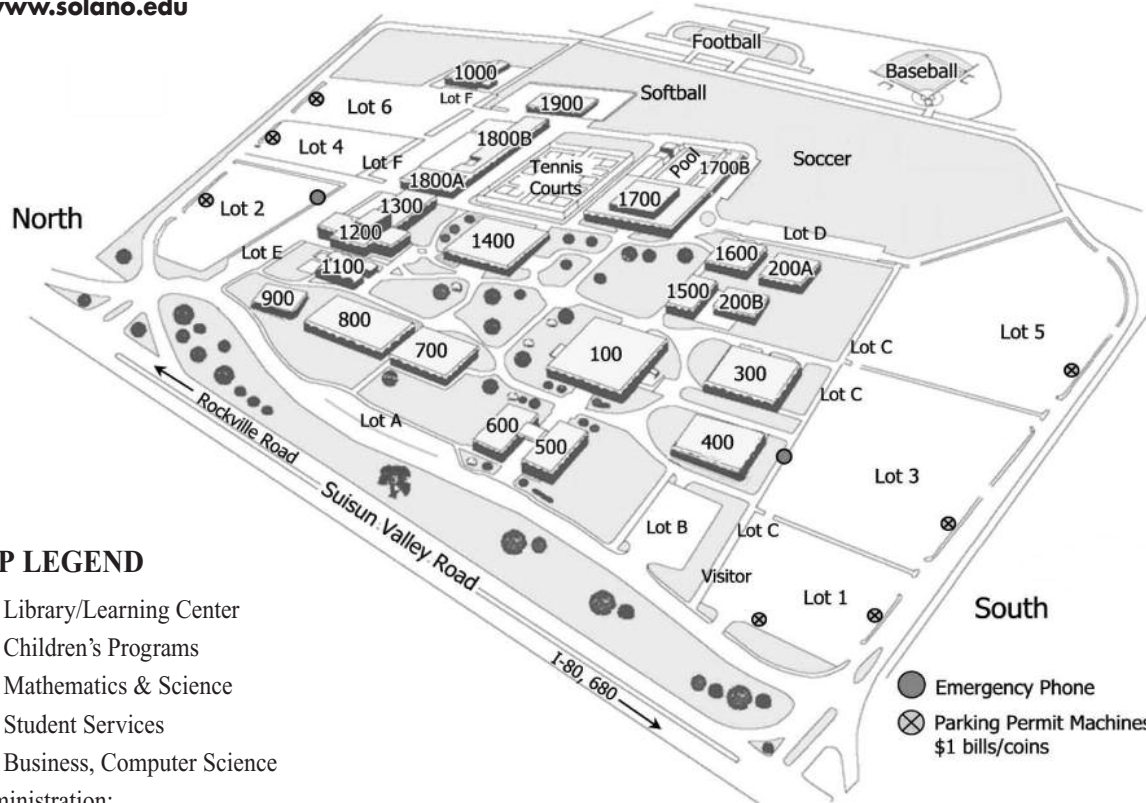

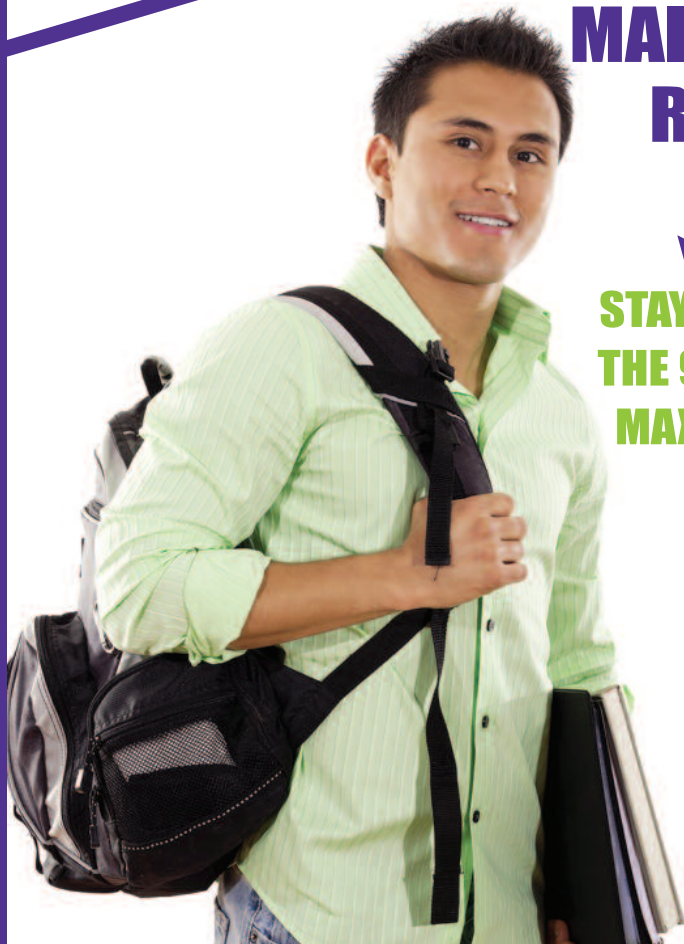
