Guided Pathways

Dr. David Williams, Vice President of Academic Affairs, gave a brief update on Guided Pathways. The steering committee has met, and they are in the process of developing a work

plan that is due March 30, 2018. A statewide Guided Pathways workshop is being held on February 26 in Rancho Cordova; a team from the College will be attending.

IEPI Indicators

Dr. David Williams, Vice President of Academic Affairs, reported that because of the BOG adopted year -four goals, it has been determined by the Chancellor's Office that the current IEPI goals framework needs to be modified in order to align with the Vision of Success goals. The current IEPI indicators will no longer be used; a simplified list of system-level metrics will be developed and applied across all initiatives to accelerate educational reform efforts in the Community College system. The Simplified Metrics initiative will refocus strategic decision beginning with the 2018-19 academic year.

CCSSE Survey

Dr. David Williams, Vice President of Academic Affairs, shared that the college will be conducting a CCSSE (Community College Survey of Student Engagement) survey in identified classes during the Spring 2018 semester, probably sometime around the last half of the semester. The survey asks students about their college experience; how they spend their time; what they feel they have gained from their classes; how they assess their relationships and interactions with faculty, counselors, and peers; what kinds of work they are challenged to do; how the college supports their learning; and so on. The survey will take approximately 40 to 45 minutes to complete. Completion of the survey is optional for students.
