Discussion: Joe reported that changes made were mostly for C-IDs. The College doesn't currently have an anthropology degree, but a new full time instructor is working on making one to match the transfer degree that will be good for students and also for the College to add one more degree toward its goal.

Erin Moore added 'This course is an open entry/open exit course. Students may continue BIO 099 over multiple semesters not to exceed 2 units.

Discussion: Margherita explained this is a skill building course that has been modified as an open entry/open exit class where students learn to dissect the human body. The course is not repeatable but students can take it again to complete the two-unit maximum credits. It has always been a variable unit

course. Regarding adding more language to the catalog, Margherita explained that usually students, only a couple at a time, are recommended and recruited for this course, so more clarification isn't needed in the catalog. Marianne suggested showing Biology 4 (anatomy) as a prerequisite in the catalog, rather than just stating students need the dean's permission. Erin Moore will make that change and she also added "open entry/open exit", and "students may continue BIO 9 over two semesters, not to exceed two units". Students have to be enrolled manually in Banner.

Discussion: Mary Gotch-Posta explained the AA Degree is the same as always but rather than grouping different classes, it is now set up with core classes and students can choose from any combination of the electives. It used to have social psychology as an alternative to research methods but now it just has the latter. Because PSYC 7 was tabled (see 6a) and both of the psychology degrees require PSYC 7, approval would be contingent on approval of PSYC 7 this semester. If PSYC 7 is not approved it can be removed, so the degree can be submitted to the Chancellor's Office, and added back later when approved. Marianne noted that PSYC 4 is an absolute requirement and statistics is the prerequisite. She queried why it wouldn't be best to just have the AA-T degree. Mary replied that instructors want to encourage students to take classes other than just the core so when they transfer they will have more exposure to psychology. Marianne expressed her concern that many students who aren't planning to transfer will be lost by having PSYC 4 in the core, especially if they are fearful of math. She hoped faculty considered that potential loss. There is more breadth with the AA as well as the standard rigor and transfer students would be encouraged to expand anyway. Mary pointed out that instructors did not feel social psychology has the proper rigor and has a high failure rate. Teachers stated students come into social psychology thinking it will be like other courses but they have to produce a very stringent paper and they don't have the same perception or preparation for research paper rigor. Joe pointed out statistics was always required for transfer but not for the class. Mary added that faculty wants students to see psychology as a science and understanding research methods is a core for psychology.

Diane has been reviewing the ACCJC standards that are under revision to be implemented in January. She suggested CR probably needs to be about a year after PR to allow time for deans and faculty to fully review before making changes. Maire noted that much has already been done in CTE/Business and should be ready for CR in the spring. Joe concluded the goal will be to eventually stagger CR out one year from PR.
