#### 11. REPORT FROM THE CHAIR

a. Update on ADTs

Joe reported that Journalism, a transfer degree that had been approved, had one course that did not pass C-ID. The course is not a degree requirement. Samanda Dorger is tasked with deciding whether to remove it from the transfer degree or revise the course to resubmit - through the C-ID process. If she decides to drop that course, it will return on the agenda as a consent item.

Physics will likely become another transfer degree for approval. Joe expressed hope that Committee members are helping their colleagues who are working on transfer degrees. He submitted an updated form to the Chancellor's Office showing the College needs 16 ADTs, rather than 18. The College has 18 of the Chancellor's Office list of 22 TMCs. However, Computer Science offers CTE degrees, not transfer, and it has a totally different TOP code. Elementary teacher education is an area of emphasis, but without an education department, the College has no degree. Due to those reasons, both Computer Science and Elementary Teacher Education were taken off the list. The College has a proposed computer science degree, but it doesn't fit the 60-unit max requirement. The Studio Arts degree gave the College a credit so a music degree is not needed. SB440 is currently on the Governor's desk. If passed, it will mandate that community colleges offer every single one of the transfer degrees and "energy credits" would not be allowed but there will be at least one more year before having to complete all of them.

## b. Archived courses deletion process

Last fall the Curriculum Committee approved a massive course deletion. On September 16, per suggestion by the SLO Coordinator, the Academic Senate requested the Committee develop a process for another massive course deletion. The SLO archive has over 300 courses that haven't been taught in recent years, that don't have SLO assessments, and some are without written SLOs. By suggesting this process be opened again, faculty will hopefully take advantage of clearing the list.

Josh explained that, due to faculty shortage, many English courses haven't been taught but faculty would want to bring them back when positions are refilled. Joe noted that the SLO archive needs to be looked at. What hasn't been and isn't expected to be offered should be deleted. Holding onto courses in the catalog is misleading students into thinking they'll be able to take a course that doesn't exist. It also misleads ACCJC. Maire noticed electronic and wind courses that are on the list were all deleted through the curriculum process and there may be other deleted courses that weren't removed from the list. Joe stated the list needs to be disseminated and courses with name/number changes and previous deletions need to be reported to clean up the list. Maire added that some of the auto classes that were archived are now being offered.

Joe will let the Academic Senate know that quite a few courses on the list may have been changed or already deleted. Senators can disseminate the list to their departments for review and compile a list of courses to be deleted. The Academic Senate will take the lead and the Curriculum Committee can place another mass deletion on an agenda if needed.

## a. Pre/Corequisite policy/procedures update

Joe announced this will be added as a regular agenda item. Erin Duane has been researching the requirements and Title V changes, and is using a table used by Alan Hancock Community College, a matrix of what changed in Title 5 with columns for current status in the institution and who is responsible. For Content Review, Title V is asking curriculum committees and discipline faculty to look at how courses are taught, quizzes, assignments, rubrics etc., in an interesting and more complete way than what has been used. Erin will work with Joe to create a plan that will hopefully address Title 5 and the State paper. Changes to the Curriculum Committee's approval process for approving requisites will have to go through the Curriculum Committee, the Academic Senate and the Board of Trustees. Training for faculty and CurricUNET form changes will be needed.

Joe welcomed Michelle Arce, the new representative for the School of Social and Behavioral Sciences.
