

# Solano Community College General Education (Local/Non-Transfer)

Solano Community College General Education is appropriate for students planning to earn an associate degree who do not plan to transfer to a 4-year institution. However, since we know students may change their education goals, please note, all of the courses on this general education pattern satisfy areas within Solano GE as well as IGETC and CSU GE-breadth unless otherwise noted, so that students who earn an Associate Degree can seamlessly transition into a transfer pathway in the future.

## Solano Community College General Education Requirements:

- A minimum of 3 units from each Area A-F
- Area G with a minimum of 3 units or Completion
- Courses may be used to fulfill both general education and major requirements
- Courses may be used in only one Area
