(1) The ability to cast an advisory vote.

The Student Trustee's presence or absence at a Board meeting shall not be counted in deciding a quorum.

(2) The right to receive compensation at the rate of \$150 per month. If special meetings are held, the \$150 will be divided by the number of meetings per month. A Student Trustee absent for the Board meetings will receive a pro-rated share of the maximum.

Example:

Month with two regular meetings = \$75 per meeting.

Month with two regular and one special meeting = \$50 per meeting.

Month with one regular meeting = \$150 for the meeting.

- (3) Student Trustee's Duties/Responsibilities The Student Trustee shall be responsible and accountable to the students of Solano Community College District as prescribed by Article III, Section K, of the Associated Students of Solano College (ASSC) Bylaws:
 - Attend all Governing Board meetings of the Solano Community College District.
 - Be expected to attend all Student Senate meetings to report to the Student Senate the activities of the Governing Board as they pertain to the students.
 - Assist the ASSC Governing Board Representative and the ASSC Executive Secretary in maintaining a record of Governing Board proceedings.
 - Be available at the ASSC office for at least three hours a week for appointments.
 - Report any absences to the ASSC Executive Secretary in advance.
 - Be responsible for finding a replacement should he or she not be able to attend the Student Senate meeting to give the required report.
 - Maintain all other rights as defined in Board Policy 1007, Board Policy 1009, Board Policy 1014, Board Policy 1017, and <u>Education Code Section 72023.5</u>.

POLICY:

With the exception of those animals specifically exempted by this policy, animals are not allowed on campus.

The following animals are permitted on District property:

- i. An animal specifically trained to assist disabled persons as a guide, service or signal dog.
- ii. On-duty police dogs.
- iii. An animal used for instructional purposes, for a limited time span, and under the immediate control of the instructor or handler with prior approval of the SCC Police Department.
- iv. One-time exceptions may be granted for events involving animals. Exceptions must be requested through the Facilities Scheduler with approval of the SCC Police Department.
- v. A leashed animal is permitted on the frontage island, the perimeter road and sidewalks, and campus access to the linear park.
- vi. Animals are not allowed in vehicles <u>unattended</u> pursuant to California Vehicle Code Section 21113 and California Penal Code Section 597.7.

Owners of animals exempt by this policy must ensure vaccinations and licensing requirements are current according to county code, are in good health, follow College leash and control regulations, and are registered with the SCC Police Department.

Due to the risk of injury from animals to persons on campus, owners of non-exempt animals found on campus will be asked to remove them. If an unrestrained animal is sighted on campus, SCC Police Department should be notified. Police Officers will request the owner to remove the animal.

Owners of animals found on campus in violation of this regulation will be subject to citation and fine as provided by the California Vehicle Code Section 21113, and/or Solano County Code Sections 8.04 through 8.12, and/or have their animals impounded by

authorized College officials, including the Solano County Humane Animal Services.



AGREEMENT BETWEEN SOLANO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT AND INDEPENDENT INSPECTIONS INCORPORATED FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

This is an Agreement made as of April 15, 2008 between Solano Community College District ("District") and Independent Inspections Incorporated ("Consultant") for the provision of specified professional services.

Consultant shall perform services in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement and shall be responsible for the means and methods used in performing services under this Agreement. Except as set forth in this Agreement, Consultant shall have no other duties or responsibilities.

Consultant shall provide for the District the following basic consulting services:

See Exhibit A.

Consultant represents and warrants that its services and all of its work, materials, equipment and processes depicted or described in the March 24, 2008 proposal or other documents prepared by Consultant shall comply with all local, state and federal laws, codes, ordinances, regulations and rules pertaining thereto.

Consultant shall submit statements for services rendered. If the District objects to any statement submitted by Consultant, the District shall so advise Consultant in writing giving reasons within fourteen (14) days of receipt of such statement. If no such objection is made, the statement will be considered acceptable by District.

Kitchell is authorized to act as the District's agent, and references to actions by "District" may be undertaken by the "Project Manager/ Program Manager', Kitchell CEM.

Consultant shall maintain appropriate accounting records which shall be made available for inspection by the District upon request.

Consultant Indemnity of District. To the fullest extent permitted by law, the Consultant shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the District and its employees, officers, Board of Trustees, individual members of the Board of Trustees, agents and representatives ("the Indemnified Parties") from any and all claims, demands, losses, responsibilities or liabilities for: (i) injury or death of Consultant's employees arising out of this Agreement; (ii) injury or death of persons or damage to property, or (iii) other costs or charges, directly or indirectly arising out of or attributable, in whole or in part, to the negligent or willful acts, omissions, errors and/or other conduct of Consultant, its Design Consultants or the employees, agents and representatives of Consultant Sub-Consultants in performing or providing any of the obligations, services or other work product contemplated under this Agreement. The foregoing shall include without limitation, attorneys fees and costs incurred by the Indemnified Parties and shall survive the termination of this Agreement until any such claim, demand, loss, responsibility or liability covered by the provisions hereof is barred by the applicable Statute of Limitations.

District Indemnity of Consultant. The District shall indemnify and hold harmless Consultant from all claims arising out of bodily injury (including death) and physical damage (other than to the Project itself and property covered by insurance under this agreement) which arise out of the negligent or willful acts, omissions or other conduct of the District

The District and Consultant respectively bind themselves, their successors and assigns and legal representatives to the terms of this Agreement. Neither the District nor Consultant shall assign, sublet or transfer any interest in this Agreement without the written consent of the other.

Nothing under this Agreement shall be construed to give any rights or benefits in this Agreement to anyone other than the District and Consultant and all duties and responsibilities undertaken pursuant to this Agreement will be for the sole benefit of the District and Consultant and not for the benefit of any other party.

All documents and specifications prepared by Consultant under this Agreement shall belong to the District. These ownership rights shall include copyrights to all such documents and specifications.

Consultant shall procure and maintain insurance for protection from claims under worker's compensation acts, claims for damages because of bodily injury including personal injury, sickness, or disease or death of any and all employees or of any person other than such employees, and from claims or damages because of injury to or destruction of property including loss of use there from, and any other insurance prescribed by laws, rules, regulations, ordinances, codes, or orders, as well as insurance required by this Agreement as set forth in Exhibit A.

Consultant shall furnish to the District proof of insurance as required in Exhibit A.

The District will also cause other independent professional associates and consultants retained by the District for the Project to procure and maintain comparable insurance coverage.

This Agreement (consisting of pages 1 & 2, Exhibit A, and Exhibit B (Independent Inspection Services Proposal Dated March 24, 2008) constitutes the entire Agreement between the District and Consultant and supersedes all prior written or oral understandings. This Agreement may only be amended or modified by a duly executed written instrument.

The cost of infant care at the neighboring programs is 7.00/hour to 7.50/hour. The cost of toddler care at the neighboring programs is 6.20/hour to 7.00/hour. The cost of preschool care at the neighboring programs is 5.00/hour.

To ease the burden of the increase, this proposal would place the hourly rates at the low end of the spectrum and minimize the additional amount parents will pay for their children's care. The increase would affect eight of the currently enrolled children.

Approval is requested by the Governing Board for the child care tuition rate increases to be effective in fall 2008.

SUMMARY:

The Board is being presented with a proposed amended agreement between the District and its Bond Program Manager, Kitchell CEM, which was approved by the Board on September 4, 2003. As outlined in the original agreement, the District would like to exercise its option under Section 4.3, which describes the criteria for additional services and amend the Kitchell CEM agreement to June 2010.

The add services will include Kitchell CEM managing the following projects: Vacaville Center, Buildings 1200, 1300, 1400, 1700, 1800A; Chillers and Boilers, and Athletic Field Renovation Projects. Additionally, as allowed under <u>Government Code Section 16720</u>, the District will hire an accountant to manage complex general ledger accounting, budget allocations, payments, reconciliation of funds and accounts, prepare financial and statistical records, and prepare reports to the Board. It is estimated that this limited-term service funded by Measure G will cost approximately \$138,000, and is subject to discontinue when funding is depleted or at the completion of the Bond program.

Amendment to the Agreement between Solano Community College District and Kitchell CEM, Inc., approved by the Board of Trustees on September 4th, 2003.
