## AGREEMENT BETWEEN SOLANO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT AND INDEPENDENT INSPECTIONS SERVICES INCORPORATED FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES FOR THE CHILLER ADDITION

This is an Agreement made as of February 18, 2009 between Solano Community College District ("District") and Independent Inspections Incorporated ("Consultant") for the provision of specified professional services.
