(b) Academic Senate

Professor Michael Wyly gave the following report:

The Senate has met twice since my last report. In that time, we have been working closely with VP Guleff to complete work in curriculum and other projects prior to her departure. On behalf of the senate, I would like to thank VP Guleff for her collaboration and leadership. In her short term at SCC, we have accomplished a lot together. We are sorry to see her go, but wish her well on this next chapter. Our loss is Butte's gain.

Second, at our meeting on Dec 5, the senate took action to approve the recommended hiring priorities for the 2017-18 AY. We look forward to working with S-P Esposito-Noy and Academic Affairs in the coming months as the College moves forward with this process. The senate also approved a syllabus template to be widely distributed as a faculty resource in the upcoming semester. Looking ahead, we continue to anticipate action on curriculum and hiring handbooks, as well as the development of pathways to SCC in partnership with local high schools.

Third, and most significantly, as you aware, the senate has passed what I would call the most significant resolution of the senate, certainly in my tenure as president, wherein we call upon the campus community to rally together around equity, fairness and the preservation of academic freedom for all of our community. At the direction of the Academic Senate of Solano Community College District, I have already presented to the S-P and Trustees copy of RESOLUTION 12.12.2016: "Endorse Local Actions by the Solano Community College Academic Senate and the Solano Community College District [SCCD] Board of Trustees in Defense of Equity for All Students, Faculty and Staff, including the Designation of SCCD as a 'Sanctuary Campus.'" As you will note, the resolution is founded on principles of academic integrity, equity, fairness and access, including our own equity and mission statements, as well as calls to action and/or direction by the Lt. Gov. of the State of CA, the CCCCO and the ASCCC. As the final item of my report,

the senate has directed me to share with you the resolves of this resolution for your information and consideration.

(d) <u>Superintendent-President</u>

Superintendent-President Esposito-Noy reported that for the January 13th Flex day, we will have Dr. Jeff Duncan Andrade here as keynote speaker. He is also an English teacher at a high school in Oakland.
