9. COMMENTS FROM MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC (CONTINUED)

Thomas Clausen and John Woodley, Outreach Coordinators for Employer Support of the Guard and Reserve, recognized Dean Shirley Lewis and SCC for support of employees who serve in the Guard and Reserve of the U.S. Military. Dr. Lewis is the recipient of the "Patriot Award" from the Office of the Secretary of Defense for "Contributing to National Security and Protecting Liberty and Freedom by Supporting Employee Participation in America's National Guard and Reserve Force".

Jim DeKloe gave an update on the Doing What Matters program. The March 31st meeting has been rescheduled to April 21st, which will be a lunch meeting at the Sheet Metal Union Hall. Karen Cook has invited the Trustees to a 3D Printing workshop for employees at the College.

Michael Wyly gave the following statement: I am here tonight as the senate president to present a statement for Item 10.A of the consent calendar. On behalf of the senate, I am here to address administrative retreat rights into faculty positions. As the Trustees are aware, per BP 2005, the Board of Trustees recognizes and endorses the rights and responsibilities assigned to the Academic Senate, including administrative retreat rights per CA Education Code 87454-87458. Firstly, allow me to communicate senate support for the retreat (per 87454) of any tenured employee when assigned from a faculty position to an educational administrative position to retain his or her status as a tenured faculty member. Secondly, as we have the case where an administrator not hired as a faculty member at SCC requests retreat rights at SCC, the senate acknowledges and supports their rights to become a first-year probationary faculty member. That said, in cooperation with HR and the S-P, the academic senate is also aware that SCC currently does not have an agreed upon procedure as required by 87458. Such a procedure would allow for "reasonable procedures to ensure that the governing board relies primarily upon the advice and judgment of the academic senate to determine that the administrator possesses the minimum qualifications for employment as a faculty member. The process shall further require that the governing board provide the academic senate with an opportunity to present its views to the governing board before the board makes a determination." As we lack clear procedures to date, I first want to thank Mary Jones and S-P Esposito-Noy for working with the senate to best approximate the spirit of the Education Code. As such, I can confirm our opportunity to confirm minimum qualifications as well as the Senate's position of support for retreat in all cases. Moreover, the senate has already begun work, in cooperation with administration, the develop formal procedures as part of our 2017 Hiring Handbook, and I look forward to sharing the results of those dialogues with the Trustees as part of my normal reports.
