The early evaluation from the engineer recommends replacement of the roofing system to address building code compliance that increases building insulation requirements. The current roofing system is nearing the end of its useful life and is scheduled for replacement in the next 2 years. As the original design scope included replacement of roof mounted HVAC units, replacement of the roofing system will be more efficient and cost effective, while improving the building's protection against water intrusion. This amendment includes the additional design scope needed for a new roofing system.

#### **SUMMARY**:

An agreement between Solano Community College District and Christopher Johnson, MSN, RN, CNOR and Nancy Maligaya, MSN, RN, CNL, CNOR for contract instruction is being presented for approval by the Governing Board. Contractors will instruct two 8-week Periop 101 Nursing courses which are approved by the Association for periOperative Registered Nurses (AORN). Students who earn their AORN Periop 101 certificate will have the opportunity to complete a preceptorship at Solano County-based healthcare facility. The contractor fee is not to exceed \$4000 per contractor, per 8-week course. The term of this agreement shall end on March 22, 2022.

#### AGREEMENT FOR CONTRACT INSTRUCTION (Not For Credit Instruction)

Solano Community College District, hereinafter referred to as "District," and Christopher Johnson, MSN, RN, CNOR & Nancy Maligaya, MSN, RN, CNL, CNOR, hereinafter referred to as "Contractors," mutually agree to the following contract provisions created pursuant to Education Code Section 88003.1(b):

- 1. Contractors represent that they are licensed and qualified, with the capability and the experience, to provide instructional services in the area of periOperative Nursing.
- Facilities will be provided by the District to conduct the program specified herein. They shall
  meet the requirements of state and local safety and health regulations during the term of the
  Agreement.
- 3. The term of this Agreement shall end on March 22, 2022. The District and Contractors will honor a schedule of meeting times to be mutually agreed upon which allows for two 8-week course (8 hours each Saturday for 8 weeks). One course will be offered in Summer 2021 and one in academic year 2021-2022. Instruction for the Summer 2021 Periop 101 course will begin July 17, 2021 and end on September 4, 2021. Instruction for the AY 2021-2022 Periop 101 course will begin January 22, 2022 and end on March 19, 2022
- 4 The location of the services shall be: 4000 Suisun Valley Road, Fairfield, CA 94534 (800 Building, Room 812).
- 5. The District will set an appropriate course cost to students. For the Summer 2021 course offering, the cost per student shall be established at \$2,500. The District shall have discretion to adjust the course cost to students for subsequent courses.
- For a fee not to exceed \$4000.00 per Contractor, per 8-week course, Contractors shall provide the following services:
  - A The Contractors will develop, coordinate, promote, deliver, and evaluate a Periop 101 course for up to 10 registered nurses (students) per class that is approved by the Association for periOperative Registered Nurses (AORN). This is a not-for-credit course.
  - B. At the course location, the Contractors will proctor the AORN-approved Periop 101 examination administered to students who successfully complete the course
  - C Except for seats (access) to the AORN Periop 101 training course for students (10 per course), Administrators (up to 2 per course), and Preceptors (up to 2 per course), the Contractors will provide all other instruction-related materials for the Periop 101 training course, examination, and preceptorship, including a Course Summary and Course Syllabus. Students will purchase their own textbooks

- D. The Contractors will provide students who earn their AORN Periop 101 certificate the opportunity to complete a preceptorship at NorthBay Healthcare and Kaiser Vacaville, or any other Solano County-based healthcare facility mutually agreed upon by the District and the Contractors, for a period of up to 3 months and/or 60 cases, whichever comes first, and will serve as the points of contact to students for the preceptorship.
- E. The Contractors will be primarily responsible for recruiting course participants.
- 7. The District shall provide the following:
  - A. For each 8-week course, the District will provide 10 AORN Periop 101 seats to be assigned to students and Periop 101 access for up to 2 Administrators and 2 Preceptors.
  - B. The District will provide appropriate facility access and usage, including classroom space and parking at the course location.
  - C. The District will provide the Contractors with a class roster prior to the start of each course. Before being added to a class roster, any waitlisted students must be randomly selected and mutually agreed upon by the District and the Contractors.
  - D. The District will facilitate any Clinical agreements required with participating healthcare facilities for the purpose of placing students into clinical experiences (preceptorship).
  - E. The District will provide use of its Simulation Room with a facilitator for up to one class session per course (8 hours maximum). Additional usage of the Simulation Room and facilitator beyond the initial 8 hours will be negotiated with the District using established rates.
  - F. The District will provide print and web-based marketing materials to assist in promoting the Periop 101 course.

Should Contractors require additional services in any of the above components, the fee shall be negotiated separately.

- 8. The instructor(s) shall be Christopher Johnson, MSN, RN, CNOR, and Nancy Maligaya, MSN, RN, CNL, CNOR
- 9 All participants/students shall be under the direction and supervision of the instructor as specified herein.
- 10 The District shall compensate Contractors for services provided pursuant to this Agreement in the amount specified within thirty (30) days following completion of each course
- 11 The District represents that all operations of the District's business are and will continue to be conducted in compliance with Title VI and VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Title IX of the Higher Education Act of 1972, the Privacy Rights of Parents and Students Act of 1974, and all applicable local, state and federal health and safety regulations

- 12 The District and the Contractors agree to mutually confer regarding renewal of the contract phor to the Contractors entering into a competitive agreement
- 13. IT IS MUTUALLY UNDERSTOOD that the Contractors and the District shall secure and maintain in full force and effect during the full term of this Agreement, liability insurance in the amounts and written by carriers satisfactory to the Contractors and the District respectively.

The District will indemnify, and hold harmless, in any actions of law or equity, the Contractors, its officers, employees, agents and elective and appointive boards from all claims, losses, damage, including property damages, personal injury, including death, and liability of every kind, nature and description, directly or indirectly arising from the operations of the District under this Agreement or of any persons directly or indirectly employed by, or acting as agent for the District, but not including sole negligence or willful misconduct of the Contractors. This indemnification shall extend to claims, losses, damages, injury and liability for injuries occurring after completion of the services rendered pursuant to this Agreement, as well as during the process of rendering such services. Acceptance of insurance certificates required under this Agreement does not relieve the District from liability under this indemnification and hold harmless clause. The Contractors will make a good-faith effort to recommend an alternate qualified instructor for any scheduled class or course for which they cannot serve as instructor during the term of this Agreement. The Contractors will obtain approval from the District prior to assigning or permitting an alternate instructor to perform any service or instruction.

15. The Contractors agree not to discriminate in the selection of any student to receive instruction pursuant to this Agreement because of sex, sexual preference, race, color, religious creed, national origin, marital status, veteran status, medical condition, age (over 40), pregnancy, disability, and political affiliation. In the event of Contractors' non-compliance with this section, the Agreement may be canceled, terminated, or suspended in whole or in part by the District.

Sample of key activities this quarter:

**<u>Program</u>**: District staff and Bond Program team members continue to work on revisions to the Design Standards. We continue planning for and implementing the projects being funded by the Series D funds, which were issued in November 2020.

#### Projects:

- <u>Library/Learning Resource Center</u> (Building 100 Replacement): Construction continues. Interior Work – mechanical/electric/plumbing rough-in, interior finishes, skylight pillow installation, elevator build-out, and restroom work. Exterior Work - rooftop units and ducting, exterior rigid insulation, storefront and window systems, and rainscreen installation.
- <u>Building 300 Modernization</u>: An architectural firm from the Board-approved consultant pool is working on an initial study to define the scope of work needed, options and to develop a ROM (Rough Order of Magnitude) cost estimate. This study is currently underway.
- <u>On Campus Housing</u>: The current focus of this project is to determine if housing on campus is viable. A consulting team was hired through an RFQ/P (Request for Qualifications/ Proposals) process. Needs assessment/market analysis and feasibility study are underway.
- <u>Infrastructure Improvements Solar Energy</u>: Using the new renewable energy consultant pool, a team has been hired to work with the District to define a Fairfield Campus solar project, which will offset energy consumption. Initial work and meetings have begun.
- <u>Early College High School Portables</u>: Portables have been delivered and are installed on site.
- <u>Early Learning Center Modernization (Design)</u> Initial study and Schematic Design Phase work was completed; and a new Early Learning Center Expansion Project will begin soon.
- <u>Fairfield Campus Building Exteriors</u> Phase 1 work was started and completed, except for installation of large graphic building identifier numbers; and installation of identifier numbers will begin as soon as they are fabricated. Phase 2 bid documents are being developed.
- <u>Pedestrian & Vehicular Wayfinding Signs</u> Vehicular signs are installed. Pedestrian signage Shop Drawings have been approved and are in fabrication.
- <u>Vacaville Classroom Building 'Annex" Renovation (Phase 2) Corbels Removal</u>: Bidding is complete, and construction will begin later in the summer.
- <u>Aeronautics Nut Tree Facility Improvements:</u> Design complete and under review with Airport, Solano County, City of Vacaville and being coordinated with PG&E.
- <u>Baseball and Softball Clubhouse Replacement</u>: Construction Documents in process.
- <u>ADA Improvements (Phase 1)</u>: Work continued on updating the ADA Transition Plan and Barrier Removal Program with data collection having been started.
