In the first-ever tennis season at Solano College, the college's team has already achieved success. **Doubles players Tommy Purcell and** J.D. Bobo have qualified to play in the annual state tournament held in Ojai, California, April 23-25.

The SCC tennis program was started by Hall of Fame coach Phil Cello as part of the Chris Camisa Tennis and Education Foundation. Cello raised the money and, with the help of Solano Athletic Director Erik Visser, was able to add the program at a time when many programs were being cut. Coach Jordan Walker hopes the success of the men's team this year will provide the momentum for starting a women's team next year.

Walker says this was a great season. "We were able to recruit nine players to play this year and, as a team, I believe we exceeded all expectations, winning two team matches and making every team we played work." A huge bonus to the season was Purcell and Bobo qualifying for the Ojai tournament. The duo won seven matches at No. 1 doubles this season and lost only five. Purcell, the Falcons' No. 1 singles player, is a very strong doubles player who has achieved 2nd team all-conference honors for his solid play. Bobo and Purcell will join the best players in the state competing at the prestigious Ojai tournament.

What's Happening at SCC?

What are the big projects happening at SCC right now?

- A) Network Infrastructure—this is a district-wide project that will increase network speeds and improve wireless capacity. It should be completed by May or June, 2016.
- B) Technology Upgrade (Computers/Classrooms) another district-wide project which will provide classrooms with the latest and greatest technology, and should also minimize downtimes that were becoming inherent with the older systems. Estimated completion date is Summer, 2016.
- C) Upgrade to Banner, the management information system, which will include the latest in Banner tools and functionality. Should be completed in Summer, 2016
