STEM Scholarship Program



The STEM Scholarship Program (21SSP) is in its third year at Solano Community College, and will expand by accepting a new group of students this spring 2018. The program is funded by the National Science Foundation (NSF) Scholarships in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics Program (S-STEM).

Two information sessions are planned – August 31 at noon in room 804 and September 14 at 2pm in room 434.

The application for new scholars to start in spring 2018 is now open in AcademicWorks and it's due October 15

The purpose of the program is to support academically talented and financially needy students to attain an associate's degree in a STEM major and/or transfer to a four-year university. In addition to financial assistance, support services are built into the program to promote student success.
