Fulbright Scholar Talks About Cells Project





The Mathematics and Science Division of Solano Community College hosted Dr. Selis Onel on 9/11/17 as part of the Fulbright Outreach Program. Dr. Onel is a Fulbright scholar at the Center for Engineering in Medicine hosted by Harvard Medical School and Massachusetts General Hospital and an associate professor of chemical engineering at Hacettepe University, Ankara Turkey.

Dr. Onel shared her multidisciplinary research at the Center for Engineering in Medicine and Hacettepe University with the faculty and the students of Solano Community College. She also informed the audience about the opportunities with the Fulbright as well as the history and the culture of her home country, Turkey.

Her talk mainly consisted on her research project on mathematical modeling for freezing and

vitrification of cells that she conducts at the Center of Engineering in Medicine of Harvard Medical School.

For this project she has been working on controlled pre-concentration of cells by encapsulation in picoliter droplets in a microfluidic system prior to preservation. She also talked about her ongoing research on optimizing a novel automatic controlled electro-chemical machining (ECM) device at Hacettepe University.

The SCC students mainly from biotechnology and biomanufacturing bachelor's degree programs as well as the faculty members from various disciplines participated the seminar.

The San Francisco-based nonprofit, which has a long history of supporting Dreamers, dedicated scholarship funds specifically to help California community college, California State University and University of California students pay for the \$495 renewal fee.

DACA students interested in applying for the scholarship opportunity should visit http://lc4daca.org to learn more and complete the online application. Scholarship applicants will need to complete a short questionnaire and will need to provide their documentation of DACA status with expiration date on or before March 5, 2018 to qualify for the financial aid.
