SCC Becomes Evacuation Center



Many thanks to the faculty, staff, and students who helped throughout the week serving food, collecting donations, and caring for those who were evacuated to bldg. 1400.

Dr. Rischa Slade and the ASSC are to be commended for coordinating the evacuation center efforts in concert with the Salvation Army from the Kroc Center.

Custodial and Grounds staff worked day and night to keep the facility clean and to make room for cots as evacuees arrived throughout the week. We could not have done such a great job without all of you who helped out.

Approximately 100 evacuees made the college home where they received meals, updates, basic necessities and support.

"When I first came here, I didn't know what to expect," evacuee Ken Cox said. "The response has been absolutely amazing. This is what community should be."

He noted the diversity in the room, adding that's what makes America the great place it is. There's no discussion of politics, just a willingness to help each other.

"We are all in the same boat," he said. There are no radios or TVs in the center so the evacuees aren't exposed to continuing coverage of the Northern California wildfires. Cell phones are the main source of news. Updates are provided three times a day by the Solano County Sheriff's Office.

On Friday, Congressman John Garamendi met briefly with Superintendent/President Celia Esposito-Noy at the college where he caught a helicopter to survey the damage done by the Atlas fire.



American Wins Pro Tennis Tournament Held at SCC



Congratulations to McKenzie McDonald, the singles winner of the NorthBay Healthcare Men's Pro Championship.

McDonald, who won NCAA singles and doubles titles in 2016 for UCLA, entered the tournament ranked No. 202 in the world and lost just one set en route to the championship.

He opened the tournament with a 6-4, 5-7, 6-1 win over sixth-seeded Stefan Kozlov of the United States, then swept Dairan King of Barbados 6-3, 6-1 in the round of 16, No. 2 Tennys Sandgren of the United States 7-6 (3), 6-2 in the quarterfinals and Christopher O'Connell of Australia 6-4, 7-5 in the semifinals to reach the finals.

In doubles, Luke Bambridge of Great Britain and David O'Hare of Ireland won the crown with the same 6-4, 6-2 count as McDonald won his, defeating Akram El Sallaly of Egypt and Bernardo Oliveira of Brazil in the finals.
