Camissa Foundation whose support and vision were critical to start both the men's and women's tennis intercollegiate programs at Solano College."



Honors Project Uses New Rock Saw

GEOL 049 is Honors Geology where geology majors have the opportunity to do independent research.

This semester, with guidance from Professor Mark, Feighner Loren Tolley, Steven Mckenzie, and Roxana Pilot (L to R in photo) took on a project with the department's new rock saw. All three chose for their project to collect rock samples (from Big Sur, Cascades,

and Mt. Lassen), and then they sawed and ground them to create thin-sections only 0.03 mm thick. Under a polarizing microscope, individual

minerals can be identified by their optical properties to unlock the history of their formation.

Past projects for Honors have included: Mineral Analysis and Historical Relevance of the Sierra Nevada Batholith, Thermal Springs of the Clear Lake Volcanic Field, and GIS mapping of Rockville Park. Two former students are now in Ph.D. programs at UC Berkeley and Michigan State.
