in Vallejo! It was clear that the students enjoy learning and working there, and the Senate enjoyed the insider's peek at the activities and learning spaces.


Students Ride Free on SolTrans

Multiple submissions from the same author will be allowed. Due to space limitations, literary submissions must not exceed 3,000 words.

SVR also accepts submissions in photography, fine art and 3-D art. Images of visual submissions should be at 300 ppi with TIFF OR JPG extensions.

A maximum of five works per artist or photographer may be submitted. SVR publishes in full color.
