Athletics Update...



Soccer: Freshman Kirstyn Gottschall added All-Northern California Region First Team honors to her impressive rookie season, announced Friday. Gottschall, the Falcons' goalkeeper and the Bay Valley Conference Most Valuable Player, finished the regular season ranked seventh in the state at goalkeeper with 138 saves. She also was the Solano Athletics September Athlete of the Month. She started all 19 matches for Solano, earning a career-high 18 saves against Evergreen Valley on September 11, and averaged 7.26 saves per game.

<u>Women's Basketball</u>: Sophomore Sierra Chapman recorded her third double-double of the season in the Falcons' 68-50 loss to LA Valley on Friday afternoon in the second round of the 42nd Annual Tom Gilcrest Invitational, hosted by College of the Sequoias. Chapman posted a 13-point, 13-rebound effort. Freshman Jada Scott tallied three steals and two assists.

Solano (4-6) heads to Los Medanos next on Tuesday, Dec. 4 for a 5:30 p.m. game that was rescheduled from November 15.

Men's Basketball: A trio of Falcons led the Solano men's basketball team to a twoovertime thrilling victory over Santa Barbara, 84-83, in the team's opening game of the Monterey Peninsula Tournament on Thursday evening.

Sophomores **Courtlund McLean** and **Andrew Mimay** and freshman **Aaron Kelly** combined for 52 of the teams points, scoring 20, 15, and 17, respectively. The Falcons (1-5) continue competition at the tournament, facing the host team, Monterey Peninsula, on Friday, Nov. 30 at 5 p.m.

Volleyball: SCC hosted the 2018 CCCAA Women's Volleyball Championships over the weekend. The American River College Beavers took home their first-ever state championship on Sunday. American River rallied to defeat Fresno City in a dramatic five sets, 25-18, 23-25, 17-25, 26-24, 15-8, in what was also the first state final meeting of two North teams in the 42-year history of the tournament. American River certainly earned its state championship in defeating Top 10-ranked state teams in Big 8 Conference champion Sierra (Round 2, Regionals), South Coast Conference South Division champion El Camino in the quarterfinals, and Orange Empire Conference champ Irvine Valley, winner of the 2017 state title in the semifinals. With the Beavers win over Fresno, Central Valley Conference winner, it meant they had beaten four consecutive conference champions in a row to cap their crown.
