Science & Veterans Center Update





With interior wall framing now in place, the labs and spaces in the new Science and Veterans Center Building are taking shape. Mechanical, electrical and plumbing distribution systems have been installed and application of gypboard wall finish is in progress.

The building exterior has received a primer and will take on its final terra cotta color as painting progresses this month. Roofing has been completed and soon the building will be fully enclosed and watertight for the winter rains. Work is beginning on site improvements around the building such as final grading, walkways, landscaping, and the large oval plaza.

Construction is scheduled to be substantially complete in January. The Veterans Center will move in over Spring Break and the Science program will take occupancy in May and June.

Volleyball Recap: Sophomore Destiny Greenwood racked up 37 kills on the day as the Solano women's volleyball team (8-7) split at the Los Medanos College Classic, falling in three (25-16, 25-22, 25-16) to Hartnell before rebounding with a four-set win (19-25, 25-12, 25-20, 25-14) over Shasta on Friday.

Greenwood tallied 14 kills and four blocks against Hartnell before earning a doubledouble with 23 kills and 10 blocks against

Shasta. She added seven digs against the Knights.

Sophomore setter **Mia Pimentel** earned nearly a double-double with 20 assists and nine kills against the Panthers, following up that performance with 40 assists and two aces against Shasta. And freshman **Kailyn Kaiser** earned three aces against Hartnell. The Falcons resume BVC play, hosting Napa Valley on Wednesday, Sept. 26 at 6 p.m.

Congrats to Destiny Greenwood, who received Player of the Week for Northern California. A first for Solano College volleyball. Destiny currently leads the STATE in kills with 236.

<u>Women's Soccer:</u> Freshman **Isabel Olmedo** scored the go-ahead goal in the 67th minute to lift the Solano women's soccer team (1-5-2, 1-0) to a 3-2 win over Yuba (3-4-1, 0-1) on Friday afternoon to open Bay Valley Conference play.

After trading goals in the first half, heading into halftime tied at 2, Olmedo broke the draw off an assist by freshman **Karla Cardinal**. Olmedo also scored the teams second goal off a cross from freshman **Grace Lee** in the 39th minute.

Freshman **Jaylynn DelRosario** scored the Falcons' first goal off a free kick in the 18th minute.

Freshman keeper **Kirstyn Gottschall** posted six saves on the day.
