Women's History Month Hosts STEM Panel





SCC Students Accepted Into NIH Internship





Congratulations to SCC student Syan Lopez who was recently accepted into the 2019 NIH Community College Summer Enrichment Program (CCSEP).


The internship is a 10 week program in Bethesda, Maryland. The long-term goal is to increase the number of community college students who transfer to four-year colleges and universities and consider careers in the biomedical sciences (At the NIH "biomedical sciences" includes everything from behavioral and social sciences, through biology and chemistry, to physics, mathematical modeling, computational biology, and biostatistics). In addition to performing full-time research in a laboratory or on a project at the NIH, CCSEP interns will meet each week as a group with students in the College Summer Opportunities to Advance Research (C-SOAR) program. Together they will participate in workshops and courses focused on the development of academic and professional skills in preparation for careers in health care and in social, behavioral, and biomedical research.

Lopez came to Solano College from the Armijo High IB program (International Baccalaureate). He had been accepted into UCLA, but chose Solano College instead with the intention of entering the BS in Biomanufacturing.
