AutoTech Students Participate in Unique Internships







On January 21, SolTrans and National Express Transit kicked off their first Maintenance Internship Program. National Express Maintenance Manager, Anthony Alves, created this two-year, paid internship program to give hands-on experience in a fully-functioning maintenance garage to students pursuing a career in automotive technology. He saw an opportunity to utilize the students enrolled in the Automotive Technician Program at Solano Community College (SCC) and the need for recently certified mechanics to replace those retiring.

Interns were required to have completed a maintenance-related course at SCC within the last two years and hold a valid driver's license. Alves decided on the finalists for the internship by looking for one final thing: the hunger to learn. Four interns made it into the inaugural technician internship: Juan Eddie Ortega, Demadjeo Simon, Francis Nanalis and Tim Mates (pictured).

SolTrans has a very diverse fleet of buses that provide local service in the cities of Benicia and Vallejo, SolanoExpress buses provide connections to BART and Amtrak, and Paratransit buses for individuals with disabilities. The more diverse the service needs, the more knowledge and skills are needed to support the various types of vehicles that provide the service. The bus fleet itself is diverse because it is comprised of vehicles from different manufacturers and uses different fuel sources: diesel, diesel-hybrid, all-electric, and compressed natural gas (CNG).

Men's Basketball: Sophomore Dunnell Stafford led all scorers with 24 points to lead the Falcons to a series-tying win over Merritt, 82-69, on Friday evening.

Stafford added 10 boards and three steals to his efforts. Sophomore **Jordan Adams** counted 17 points, while sophomores **Uriah Benning** and **Berry Roseborough** chipped in 13 points apiece. Solano (11-13, 6-6) head to Marin next on Wednesday, Feb. 12 for a 5:30 p.m. tip.

<u>Women's Basketball:</u> Sophomore **Vanessa Hughes** paced the Falcon offense in the team's 64-56 win over Merritt on Friday evening.

Hughes scored a team-high 17 points with six rebounds and three steals. Freshman **Zaire Brown** counted a double-double with 13 points and 12 boards, adding a pair of steals, while freshman guard **Lexi Derf** put up 14 points off the bench.

Solano was edged in the second quarter, heading into the break down by three, but easily rebounded in the second half to hold on for the win.

The Falcons (14-9, 9-2) head on the road to Marin next on Wednesday, Feb. 12. Tipoff is scheduled for 7:30 p.m.

Swimming: The swim team did great at the City College of San Francisco Invite. **Pamela Kennedy** was second in the 100 Backstroke with a 1:06.09, forth in the 50 Freestyle with a 27.01. **Tyler Walhood** was 4th in the Men's 100 Breaststroke with a 1:06.94.

<u>Baseball:</u> The Solano baseball team's late rally fell short in its 5-4 series finale loss at Sierra on Friday afternoon.

Sophomore **Brandon Herter** and freshmen **Nathan Jessell** and **Herbie Lane** collected two hits each with Herter and Lane each counting a double. Sophomore **Matthew Hansen** earned two of the team's three RBI.

Sophomore starter Connor Corporale (0-2) was charged with the loss on the mound after throwing 5.1 innings, allowing four runs on three hits and striking out a pair. Solano (2-4) looks to rebound when it hosts Skyline on Tuesday, Feb. 11 at 2 p.m. at Laurel Creek Park.

<u>Softball</u>: The Solano softball team split their home opener this weekend, falling 11-4 to college of sequoias and beating Shasta college 7-3. **Ari McIntye** shined on the mound only allowing 7 hits in 6.1 innings of work against Shasta. Bats were alive with both **Hailey Enriquez** and **Lyndsey Urricelqui** going 3-7 on the day. The falcons also had a triple play in the top of the 2nd inning of the second game. Shasta lines into a triple play, shortstop Alves to second baseman Ibarra to first baseman Shumway.

<u>Tennis:</u> Women participated in their first Modesto Tournament this past week and returned with match experience, success and a better understanding of the season ahead.
