# Political Science Professor Bundenthal Interviewed for News Segment



KPIX TV aired a <u>news segment</u> where Political Science Professor Thomas Bundenthal and some of his students were interviewed about the upcoming presidential election.

Bundenthal said smart candidates already realize that they are actually speaking to early voters located all across the country.

"It isn't just those people they meet in the diner

in Iowa that they're influencing," Bundenthal said. "Everybody in the United States is going to see the Facebook posts and the clips of that. So they're kind of campaigning everywhere, all the time, anyway."

But Bundenthal says it can also have a downside for candidates, as well. If they do well in early primaries, they won't get any momentum from those in other states who voted early. And though his students may not support President Donald Trump, they acknowledge that he is generating a lot of interest in this election. Solano County is the first in the nation to mail ballots to voters.


