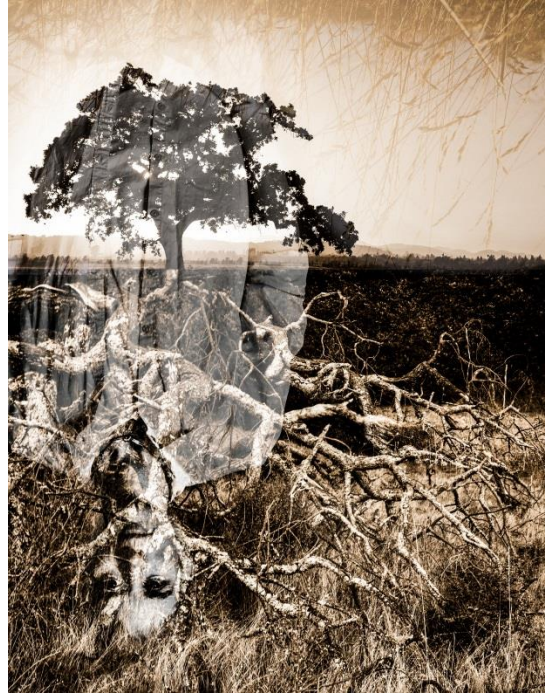

1. **Puzzled? About Your Students – Come to our Enlightening Workshop – Students on the Spectrum – Autism, Building 700, Room 701** (*Limited to 52 participants*), Diane Cheney (MS, LMHC, NBCC) has worked over 30 years in various educational settings, including as an adjunct CC instructor, as a tenured LD Specialist, as a Special Education teacher in Grades K-12, and as a consultant. In these roles, she has had a special interest and extensive experience working with students with autism (ASD). She has completed advanced graduate work and research in ASD, plus completed certification as an ASD professional through UC Davis. Diane currently works at Ohlone College as a LD Specialist.

Tips and insights will be shared with faculty to address the increasing numbers of students on the autism spectrum (ASD) who are now attending Solano. All Faculty, especially those teaching Multimedia or English courses, are encouraged to attend. Topics will include:

- What autism looks like in the classroom.
 - What autism looks like with assignments.
 - What autism looks like when there's a test.
 - Understanding the challenges you are dealing with.
 - Understanding the challenges the student is dealing with.
 - Practical tools/strategies when communication breaks down.
 - Any questions and concerns that you may have!
