The Aon Apprenticeship Program at a Glance

If you're seeking a real-world alternative to a standard four-year college or university curriculum, or simply a change of career path, an apprenticeship with Aon offers the opportunity to earn while you learn and gain practical, hands-on experience while working towards industry-recognized qualifications.

Unlike internships, this program combines your educational endeavors with full-time employment. Our apprentices receive paid tuition, books and fees for a two-year Associate Degree, and authentic workplace experiences to develop your skills and earn a competitive salary while you learn.

The Aon Apprenticeship Program Story

Launched in the United States in 2017 with a modest cohort of 26 apprentices, the Aon Apprenticeship Program has built a network of employers, non-profit partners and community colleges to create more than 1,000 Apprenticeship positions in the Chicagoland area alone.

Since 2021, the program has grown to nine metro areas, each developing their own respective networks, and has welcomed almost 300 apprentices.



Learn While You Earn

Learn on-the-job and pursue an Associate Degree with an Aon-partnered college. Aon pays for your tuition, books and fees!

As a certified Apprenticeship Program with the US Department of Labor, we work closely with local community colleges to build curricula that allow apprentices to complete their studies and apply their knowledge through real-world experiences. You'll dedicate approximately 40 hours per week to a combination of office and classroom time from Monday through Friday. And you're a full-time employee, paid for the full 40 hours -- that's both time in the office and time attending classes!



Apprentices are involved in meaningful work from day one. By learning on-the-job with a supportive team to provide guidance, you will quickly gain valuable business knowledge. We see apprentices as the future of Aon and prepare you for success with fully-integrated training programs as well.

You'll also earn a starting salary of \$42K-\$46K, depending on location, and receive full Aon employee benefits, including:

- Incremental salary increases throughout the program, if meeting requirements
- · Health insurance, including spousal and family
- \cdot Life insurance
- Paid time off, including vacation, company holidays and sick time
- · Other workplace perks, benefits and programs

Program Structure

- Two-year program that balances on-the-job training at Aon with in-school classroom learning at an accredited partner college.
- Apprentices dedicate a combined 40 hours per week working in the office and attending classes selected by Aon to complete their Associate Degree with a concentration in business - Aon covers tuition, fees and books.
- Apprentices must maintain good academic standing while completing their studies (e.g., must maintain a "C" or better in their courses).
- As an apprentice, you will have a designated Career Navigator provided by an external partner organization throughout the two-year program. They will work closely with you to ensure you have the necessary support to balance work, school and life, while also providing both personal and professional development for the duration of the program.



Apprenticeship Application Requirements

- High school diploma or equivalent and deemed college-ready by a partner community college
- Minimum age of 18 at the start of onboarding activities
- Eagerness to learn and develop yourself through training, on-the-job experiences and classroom learning
- Strong verbal and written communication skills with the ability to effectively communicate via email and phone
- Effective time management skills with the ability to prioritize tasks and complete them with a high level of accuracy and attention to detail
- A commitment to teamwork and collaboration while taking a customer-focused approach to work
- Intermediate knowledge of Microsoft Office (Word, Excel, Outlook, and PowerPoint)



What to Expect Throughout the Application Process

The application process opens in November and closes in March

Whatever your previous skills or experiences, the Aon Apprenticeship Program offers positions across business areas with exciting opportunities to jumpstart your career!

Your job responsibilities may include:

- Creating and updating reports to assist colleagues with their clients
- Assisting in client meeting preparation by scheduling meetings, creating presentations and conducting research
- Helping to manage projects by drafting and updating project plans including identifying risks and issues
- Streamlining communications between team members
- Managing data entry and learning the basics of data analysis
- Ensuring process and procedure materials are updated
