At this meeting we did not mention a degree for transfer, but the classes I was signed up for were actually part of the transfer requirements, but I was not aware of that at this time.

In July of 2019 I went back to the Fairfield Campus and met w/ the original counselor due to having 2 of the classes I signed up for being canceled. It was then discovered that I had been scheduled for course not following an degree route I wanted and we re-scheduled my schedule. Although I had been helped, I am now taking 2 classes that are recommended NOT to be taken concurrently, and am struggling more on the
