6. AS President Update

6.1 Program
Discontinuance

AS President Jaimez announced that Journalism AA will be discontinued while the ADT will remain. A meeting will be held in the future to discuss a proposal of a new certificate, which will require creating two new courses.

6.2 Stanback-Stroud Award

Senator Hidy nominated Andrew McGee, Automotive Technology department, for Stanback-Stroud Award. AS President Jaimez is waiting for another document before moving forward to submit this application to ASCCC.

6.4 Guided Pathway Coordinator

There has been a suggestion to have a Co-Chair for Guided Pathway Coordinator. Also, a crossover will be designed between GP and First Year Experience (FT3). The GP Steering committee has scheduled a meeting on February 19, 2021 to discuss the job descriptions for FT3 and GP Coordinators.

AS President Jaimez had a meeting with ASSC on January 26, 2021 where they discussed the "Outcomes" result from the previous Senate's joint meeting with Administrators, SESC, Minority Coalition. She will attend ASSC meeting on February 2, 2021 to determine what items could be prioritized this semester and how these could be point of topics during future PD/Flex Cal events.

12. Information/Discussion Items

12.1 Correctional Education

Interim Associate Dean of External Program Peter "Tony" Zitko presented a video regarding, "Corrections Educational." The following topics were shared: (a) general update on Correctional Education Spring 2021 (i.e. preparing items for delivery is an enormous task, 705+ enrolled as of February 2021), (b) COVID-19 impact and correspondence education (i.e. extensive quarantine since December, which will likely to continue next semester, correctional mail system), (c) improvements with correspondence delivery (i.e. course and assignment packages, tracking information, student-instructor interaction, pick-up/delivery schedule, timeline, regular meeting, etc.) (d) summer and fall course scheduling (i.e. delays in scheduling and delivery of course materials, challenges with 8-week term, completing student grades, faculty compensation for post-semester grade submission/revision), (e) alignment with degree offerings, and (f) grade revisions for previous semesters. He informed Senators that correspondence in Fall 2021 is not finalized and in a few weeks they will be discussing instructors they will need.

Senator LaCount shared one process that has improved. She has been working with Jim Anderson (Counseling department) and utilizing Microsoft Team where they are able to meet with students from CMF and help review their transcripts.

Senator Beam explained that a four-unit course could be divided into two two-unit course (i.e. Part I, Part II) per semester.

VP Williams shared that Administrators have started discussing these topics (i.e. hiring correctional faculty, students prefer in-person when it comes to English and Math courses, time/room constraint, and etc.)

12.2 Coordinators Meeting: Master Schedule

AS President Jaimez presented, "Master Schedule: Assessment, Curriculum, and Program Review." This topic will be placed under Action Item on the next Senate meeting.

12.3 Senate Elections: March 15, 2021 AS President Jaimez reminded Senators to discuss Senate election during their school meetings. The deadline to provide this information is March 15, 2021. AS Past President Wyly will be in charge of election process for at-large and part-time faculty.

12.4 Commitment to Anti-Racist Practices and Equity in Education There were no updates provided.

13.1 Academic Program Review

APR Chair Rachel Purdie shared, "APR Committee Goals and Self-Assessment" (see attached document). The committee has completed the following goals: (a) feedback was used to revise the template, (b) revised templates were approved by Senate, and (c) both 6-year and 2-year templates are available on eLumen. The following items are in process to be completed: (a) completion of Social and Behavioral review, (b) contact Deans of Health Sciences and Counseling to give overview of eLumen module, (c) provide survey to Health Sciences and Counseling.

AS President Jaimez announced that APR committee needs representatives from School of Applied Technology and Business, School of Social and Behavioral Sciences, School of Health Science, and Office of Research and Planning.

13.2 Student Equity and Success Council

SESC Chair Scott was not able to attend this meeting.

13.3 Curriculum/Tech Review

Curriculum Chair Sarah Barsness shared, "Curriculum Goals and Self-Assessment" (see attached document). The following items are in process to be completed: (a) she will present during March 2021 Flex to discuss equity and anti-racism, (b) will be discussing revision of faculty handbook, (c) reviewing Local GE approval process, and (d) will communicate with faculty regarding broader Curriculum goal. AS President announced that Curriculum Committee needs representatives from School of Liberal Arts, School of Social and Behavioral Sciences, and second representative from ASSC.

13.4 Calendar Committee

Curriculum Chair Sarah Barsness attended the Calendar Committee as a representative of Academic Senate. She shared that that the committee discussed the benefits and disadvantages of compressed calendar (16 weeks). If decided, this will be in affect during 2023-2024

academic year. A survey will be released to staff, faculty, and students to acquire their feedback regarding compressed calendar.
