AS President Update 6.1 Senate 2021-2023 Term, Senate Election (Senator-at-Large, Adjunct Senator-at-Large)	AS President Jaimez announced that the following Senators will be serving during 2021-2023: AS Secretary/Treasurer Duane (Senator-at- Large, Learning Resource Center), Senator Erica Beam (Accounting Faculty), Senator Jim Long (Biological Sciences Faculty), Lauren Taylor- Hill (Anthropology Faculty), Senator Michael Reilly (Music Faculty), and Senator Vitalis Enemmuo (Nursing Faculty) (see attached document).There are two faculties running for Adjunct Senator-at-Large position and election will completed by the end of the month.
6.2 May 10/17, 2021 Senate Tentative Meeting	Senators voted to reschedule May 10, 2021 tentative meeting on to May 17, 2021.
6.3 Senate's Virtual or Live Get Together	Senators voted to have in-person get together before the end of the semester and more information will be shared once finalized.
6.4 SCC Graduation 2021 and Senate Video for Graduation Update	This year's SCC graduation will be held virtually. In support of students graduating in May 27, 2021, the Senators will create a short video which will be forwarded to Info@JamesThomasMedia.com as soon as possible.
6.5 <u>2021 Leadership</u> <u>Institute</u> June 16-18, 2021	AS President Jaimez encouraged Senators to attend this virtual event hosted by ASCCC and to contact the Senate Office if interested.

6.6 <u>Black Student Success</u> <u>Week</u> April 26-30, 2021	SCC has advertised this event and lunch time webinars have been scheduled. If necessary, Senators will have a scheduled discussion about several topics with SCC students.
6.7 Summer Projects	AS President will be working on the following projects this summer: (a) Peer Review Pilot, (b) review Hiring Manual with VP Williams and HR Manger, and (c) Inherently Inaccessibly Content Faculty Guide.
6.8 Hiring	The hiring/interview committees will be announced before the end of the semester for the following positions: (a) Nursing faculty (FT), (b) Vice President of Finance, and (c) GP PACE Coordinators (20% release time)/Department Leads (stipend).
6.9 Tenure/DF Mugs	SCC Makers Space and Ceramics departments will not be able to create/design mugs/glasses for Distinguished and Tenured faculties this year. Senators voted on a mug to be given to to be Tenured and Distinguished faculty this academic year.
6.10 Other	PTK students will be doing a land acknowledgement project, which is their college project a requirement in order to obtain stars for their chapter. This proposal will be under Action Item on the next Senate agenda and will also be shared with College Governance.
7. Superintendent- President Report	S/P Celia Esposito-Noy announced that Dr. Frank Harris will be presenting on April 30, 2021 from 1:00 pm to 2:00 pm. A reminder about this event will be sent out the following week. Also, Dean Lewis has scheduled series of activities in support of Black Student Success Week. She explained that SCC has started discussing contract details with Brian Travis, who was a previous SCC Lieutenant, and will be hired to help evaluate campus safety/security. This effort is consistent with what is occurring at other colleges nationwide. Once approved by the Board of Trustees, Brian Travis will reach out to students, faculty, staff, and Administrators for input. SCC will continue its month to month contract with Solano County Sherriff's Office. S/P Celia Esposito-Noy expressed her appreciation to all who participated in Advisory Committee for diversity, equity, and inclusion. She shared that Dr. Stanback-Stroud will be hosting a self/collective assessment session before the end of the semester and she asked for Senators' input on what topics this group should focus on next semester.
 8. VP of Academic Affairs Report 8.1 Credit for Prior Learning Update 	VP Williams announced a procedure is being drafted by CPL Task Force. This procedure is a state requirement. A Professional

	Development training will be scheduled during Fall of 2021 to train faculty on how to assess prior learning.

9.1 PACE Coordinators and GP Counselor Coordinator	The job duties and responsibilities of PACE Coordinators and GP Counselor Coordinator have been submitted to Human Resources department with the goal of hiring completion by the end of the semester.
9.2 Chatbot	The Deans of Student Services will begin data entry/testing for their respective areas next week. The chatbot will be available by semester's end.
9.3 ASSC Election	The Associated Students Solano College 2021 Spring election will occur during the second week of May.
 10. It was seconded by Senator Wesley. The motion was approved unanimously.
11. Action Items, Including Items Removed from Consent	
11.1 Hiring Prioritization	AS President Jaimez presented, "Hiring Prioritization" and "Faculty Staffing Request Form" (see attached documents). She outlined the updates made on these documents. Senator Ayala motioned to approve these items. It was seconded by Senator Sytsma. Senator Beam abstained. The motion was approved by majority of the vote.
11.2 Resolution 04.19.2021: Statement in Solidarity with AAPI Community	AS Vice President Scott expressed his appreciation to students, faculty, and staff that participated in creating this resolution. AS President Scott, AS Administrative Assistant Kaushal, and FASU President Smail read, "Resolution 04.19.2021: Statement in Solidarity with AAPI Community" (see attached document). The Senators provided their feedback and edits of this document. Senator Reilly motioned to approve the updated version of this document. It was seconded by Senator Purdie. The motion was approved unanimously.

12. Information/Discussion Items	
12.1 Optional Hours Request Form	PDFC Co-Chair Michelle Smith presented, "Optional Hours Request Form" (see attached document). She explained the differences between the existing form that faculty currently use compared to the new form in PD system, which is scheduled to launch soon. She clarified that PDFC grant fund application is not available on the new system at this time. However, faculty and staff have the SCC PD website link if interested in applying for funding. Senators are asked to send an email to <u>pdfc@solano.edu</u> or <u>Sheila.Kaushal@solano.edu</u> if interested in testing this system before launch.
12.2 ACCJC Annual Report	VP David Williams presented, "ACCJC Annual Report" (see attached document). He explained the following items: (a) data between 2019 through 2020 are outlined in this report, (b) enrollment rate has decreased not just in SCC but across California (30%-50%), (c) only 6 out 116 colleges have increased enrollment, (d) midterm report will be due on October 2021, (e) SCC has exceeded stretch/aspirational goal; however, if individual student performance is reviewed by group, there will be disproportionate impact in which the college will address, (f) SCC is one of the 15 community colleges that offers Bachelor's degree, and (g) job placement rate (e.g. Biotechnology, Office Technology, Water and Waste Technology, Nursing, Fire Technology, and Cosmetology). He announced that both UC and CSU have new leaderships and will discontinue their oppositions against California community colleges' Bachelor's degree programs. Lastly, the Accreditation Steering Committee will be reviewing stretch goals to determine whether assigned numbers should be higher. AS Past President Wyly inquired whether percentage of cohorts could be added under Bachelor's Degree data.
12.3 Academic Senate Term Limits/Inviting Faculty to the Senate Table: Pros and Cons	AS President Jaimez continued the conversation on how to increase faculty participations/interest in Senate, Senate committees, and college committees. They Senate discussed: (a) assigning term limits, at this time, may not be the correct approach on how to increase faculty participation, (b) an existence of a bigger issue, (c) sending a survey to faculty, (d) communicating multiple ways on how potentially interested faculty can be part of committee service or ad hoc, (e) reviewing different committees that might interest faculty during their first and second year, (f) assigning a PD session to increase awareness of Academic Senate and different committees that faculty could be part of, (g) being a member of a committee could be a huge responsibility but will enable to faculty to have "a voice" on issues presented, (h) the challenges of not knowing the full discussion of the debate/topic due numerous emails that faculties receive, (i) creating a group discussion board using the new PD system, (j) scheduling challenges/logistic limits (e.g. family schedule, trainings/competition), (k) a new software

	meeting system (e.g. OWL) will be used, which will help accommodate faculty who cannot be in-person during Senate meetings, and (j) drafting a "call to serve" letter and committee list.
12.4 ASCCC 56 th Spring Resolution Results/Plenary Update	The result of 2021 Spring Resolutions will be shared during the next Senate meeting as some topics needed to be finalized by ASCCC due to numerous amendments added. This will also give Senator Beam an opportunity to share her feedback about this event.
12.5 Commitment to Anti- Racist Practices and Equity in Education	SESC Committee Chair Josh Scott announced that the group's next meeting will be on April 23, 2021 and VP Cooper will be presenting Student Equity Plan for 2021-2022 and how to support African America students (e.g. Umoja program). He's still waiting to hear from VP Diamond on how CARES Act fund are utilized.
13. Reports 13.1 Assessment Committee	Assessment Committee Chair Andrew Wesley announced that more than 80 faculties attended the scheduled Assessment PD session in March 2021. Notifications will be sent out in May 2021 to remind faculties what tasks they need to complete and timeline involved. As Distinguished Faculty Award Committee Coordinator, he shared that they have received 2 nominations for full-time and 2 nominations for part-time. The winners of this award will be announced during the May 3, 2021 Senate meeting.
13.2 Distance Education Committee	Distance Education Committee is working on final reviews and added additional meeting to review all shells submitted.
13.3 Professional Development/Flex Cal Committee	PDFC Co-Chair Michelle Smith provided an update during item 12.1.
