1,816 students took a CW/EW in Spring '20; 232 in Summer '20, 863 in Fall '20 (total, with possible semester-to-semester duplication: 2,911)

Disproportionate impact:

- African American
- EOPS students
- DSP students
- 18-24 year olds
- men

If we include students who took EW/CW during the pandemic, we see the following:

## F2F success rates dropped for all demographics during the pandemic (total -3.4%)

Disproportionate impact:

- Hispanic (-3.5%)
- White (non-Hispanic) (-4%)
- EOPS students (-7%)

Online success rates improved over the pandemic by 1.3%, but least for African American (0.6%) and Hispanic students (0.4%)

- However, these two populations saw a decrease in success online during the pandemic
  - EOPS students (-8%)
  - Foster Youth (-3%)

Solutions / Senate Action/ Advocacy

## Advocacy role: School/administrative action

- reach out to students who took CW/EW. What can we do to help get you back on track?
- increase in-person staffing in library and elsewhere / advocate for space for students
- need staffing for IR so we can follow up and learn more about these populations
- bring back centers (especially Vallejo) and support for students at these locations

## Senate partnership role (with Administration and larger campus community)

- need to create a cohesive, community-wide process to decide what in-person offerings are in the best interest of students, focusing on target populations, success rates of online classes, etc.
  Departments need to look at and consider discipline-specific responses to online/f2F. Look at class schedule...hybrid classes are unclear and confusing to students.
- Focus on student/staff mental health support

## Senate role:

Create faculty survey and/or discuss with schools: what might have impacted success rates?
What are we hearing students need to thrive? What was the impact of the pandemic on your

- classes? Your pedagogy? How can the Senate and campus support you as you support online and F2 students?
- As a Senate, get an update on unused/unallocated SEA and COVID funds and the status of the Equity Plan. What supports are we providing students? What supports could target EOPS, Foster Youth, African American, Latino/x students. Focus on personal touch interactions, campus pride, campus community. Invest in Noncredit workshops, how to come back to college F2F.
