AS President Scott and VP Williams presented the hiring prioritization process for this meeting:

- Presenters had 3 minutes to share information about each position.
- Clarifying questions could be asked for 2 minutes after each presentation.
- At the end of all presentations, there was a general discussion.
- Senators and Deans were encouraged to utilize the rubric except for the Program Review line item.
- Ranking sheets are due by 9:00am on Wednesday, October 26th.

Guidelines for the ranking sheets:

- Each position must receive a ranking.
- There should be no blank lines or ties.
- Positions are ranked from lowest number (highest rank) to highest number (lowest rank).

After the presentations were completed, AS Scott reviewed the key points from the October 11th meeting. These included the following:

- Data-driven priorities, i.e. adjunct overload rates and small departments.
- Connections to workforce and community
- Qualitative data, i.e., considering our mission
- Positions that serve our diverse population
- Support positions such as library and counseling
- Emphasis on Equity
- Consideration of students in the Rising Scholars program

Discussion topics included the following points (comments, questions, etc.):

- Is it possible to consider making some shifts in hiring positions, considering the current budget and continued recession?
- Our FON (Full-time Faculty Obligation Number) needs to be considered. Solano is currently over FON to maintain a buffer, and the president is expected to keep our numbers at a level to remain fiscally responsible.
- Do we have alternative funding? In the past we have partially funded some positions and absorbed them over time.
- The policy regarding retirees is that a position cannot be posted until a letter of retirement has been submitted.
 Retirement letters may be submitted 6 months or less from the date of retirement. There are no "replacement positions".
- The question was raised if we are spreading ourselves too thin? Why do we have such a large need for faculty, yet we are over FON? Have we just added too many disciplines over the years?
