12. Information/Discussion Items

12.1 Student and Faculty Support on the Vacaville Campus – What is working? What is needed?

Flor de Maria Cruz, Nathan Rexford, Karissa Brown

Flor de Maria Cruz, Supervisor of the Vacaville campus shared the following presentation which focused on how the center was functioning in the past, how it is currently doing, and how we can move forward to reach center goals. She included data from a student survey which showed that there is a need for more courses, resources, and activities at the center. Specifically, students expressed a need for additional ASTC and counseling services. Tutoring services are very limited because qualified instructional assistants who are required to supervise peer tutors are not available to come to the centers.

ASSC Representative, Karissa Brown shared concerns that the facilities in Vacaville are inferior to those at the main campus. In addition, students would like more faculty to consider teaching on the Vacaville campus. Not enough classes are offered on the Vacaville campus.

Areas that the Academic Senate could focus on to support the centers:

- Scheduling
- Advocate for ASTC, library and counseling
- Offer more classes (possibly have an initial lower enrollment; encourage all faculty to teach at the centers)
- Consider the issue of pay for student tutors as well as support for students with special needs
- Enrollment concerns students often sign up for classes very late, so waiting before cancelling classes would be helpful
- GE courses at the centers need faculty to volunteer
- Building community fun activities, clubs, etc. to motivate students

The Academic Senate will meet at the Vallejo Center on March 27th. After this meeting, more concrete actions, resolutions, etc. will be formulated to support both campuses.
