#### SENATE PRESIDENT'S UPDATE

- Rebecca LaCount The new course numbering implementation requirement has many unforeseen implications and now has a rescheduled start date of July 2024 (not to be completed by 2024).
- Josh Scott As of April 26<sup>th</sup>, new legislation requires DEIA evaluation metrics on faculty evaluations and tenure review. (Title V regulation sec <u>53602</u>.)
