### INFORMATION/DISCUSSION ITEMS

#### **Department Chair Taskforce**

- See <u>notes</u> from 4/26 meeting: the group brainstormed many supporting points for Chairs and a list of tasks/responsibility ideas (committees, hiring, mentoring, schedules, student liaison, public point of contact, outreach, departmental growth, etc)
- Various union issues still exist (compensation, identification/election/hiring these roles, evaluations of chairs)
  - Andrew: can PT faculty become chairs?
  - Tony: Are rotating chairs an option? How would this work between large vs small depts?

The goal is to hold a Fall flex event so that the taskforce can get feedback from all faculty, to finalize the work of the group, and to provide this feedback to the Union for future negotiations.

#### ZTC Update & Alignment with Program Pathways - Attius Frey

The next stage of our ZTC process is to determine how to spend the Chancellor's Office funding (\$180K), developing a stipend program, and creating ZTC pathways. Thank you to Irving Chin (?) from Tassel, who culled our pathways website to identify possible holes/opportunities for this project.

After talking to faculty, it seems that lack of knowledge/info related to ZTC is a primary hurdle. Atticus is considering creating a Canvas course on ZTC that faculty can take for compensation. Atticus requests that Senate create a task force or group to review the stipend program/applications.
