are still being refreshed and access to those spaces is in the works. Please let the President's office know if you have questions or know of negative impacts.

VPSS Neeley is working on transit opportunities between campuses. Bus stop in front of 600 will move to front of 400, affording better proximity to student services (seating and overhead coverage in the works). (*Update from VP Williams as of 8/28/24: the plan to move the bus stop from 600 to 400 has been rescinded due to safety and construction concerns.*)

President Meet & Greets: campus gatherings with CSEA and Local 39 have already taken place; CTA gatherings are in the works. Dr. Butler has also met with local stakeholders including the Solano County Economic Development Corporation and FSUSD, etc. Vallejo opportunities are in the works (they have a new superintendent). Dr. Butler will be visiting division meetings tomorrow to interface with faculty.

Accreditation: The team will visit next month (9/24 and 9/25) so preparations are underway.

Fraudulent enrollment: seems to be hitting mostly online classes w/o prereqs and 8 week classes. Some of the enrollments are using AI to maintain their enrollment as well.

VP OF ACADEMIC AFFAIRS REPORT

Bathrooms in 700 and 1500 needed a massive overhaul; bathrooms in 500 and 800 require revamps as well but will be worked on at night.

Early College is set up now in portables next to the Theater with some EC staff temporarily relocated to 900 (a welcome desk will sit in 900 to keep EC students from wandering, etc.)

While 1600 renovations are taking place, Cosmetology has been relocated to Campus Lane.

New adjunct faculty lounge is in Building 300; redesigned as a part of the building's upgrade.

Enrollment: financial aid disbursement happens on day 1 so please try to engage with an assignment as soon as you can. False enrollments actually steal an identity. It is easier to re-add a student than to deal with a fraudulently enrolled person. Assignments stay in Canvas if you drop them. AI bots are even pretending to be a student needing to be excused from class due to vacation.

ATB/CTE to SBS redistribution: this decision was based on a workload issue to ensure deans had manageable responsibilities. Dean of ATB has huge budget and needs to interface with the community heavily. Every school has some CTE in it. Discussion re: role of guided pathways as helping students know what's available (vs the title of the division → ex: there's no school of visual and performing arts).

Update from VP of Technology Services (Passwords, FalconNest, etc.)

Passwords need to be moved from 8 to 15 characters; it is statistically improbable that longer and complex passwords can be breached. Multi factor authentication will be rolled out later this Fall.

Chromebook distribution is now centralized under IT (no longer in student services or library). Send students to IT at Studentcheckouts@solano.edu to get a chromebook (see John's recent email for details)

MySolano is at end of life; FalconNest is the new iteration. A prototype has been developed, feedback has been collected. A soft launch is scheduled for this October for more feedback, then we will set up a go-live date to make the switch (MySolano will remain active during transition).

Features: mobile friendly, customizable home page, searchable (discover button)

What's next: training workshops (mid-semester flex), tutorial development, continue card development, ongoing feedback
