PUBLIC COMMENTS

The Wintun Nation donated a significant amount of money to the SCCEF scholarship fund.

SENATE PRESIDENT REPORT

Faculty Hiring Committees: in keeping with past practice, student participation is encouraged and desired on these committees. Preference is at least one student per committee, from that discipline; please see recent emails with more info about these committees and how you can help. A survey was sent out last Thursday calling for faculty volunteers, particularly for non-discipline faculty. Senate Exec will meet on Monday to fine tune groups, and then bring these groupings back to Senate for approval.

Department Chair Update: the workgroup is developing rubrics, compensation and job descriptions to ensure there's no redundancy between chairs and faculty.

PDFC Committee Update & Discussion - Nazia Mostafa

Goals and self-assessment

- Improve equity: recruit committee members to match Academic Senate bylaws, pursue Professional Development funding for staff, ensure flex cal sessions are inclusive, distribute post-flex surveys (January & March)
- Improve the VRC user experience: video accessibility & functionality, collaborate with HR and IT to integrate Keenan training for credit, spread awareness about the external training form

Spring 2025 flex: Jan 9th (optional) & Jan 10th (required)

• Submission to present at Spring Flex is due 11/15

Title V Revisions are in the works: changes will include student workers, to allow them to attend PD as part of their normal work hours. No timeline yet for these revisions; it's still at the state level.

SUBCOMITTEE REPORTS

Academic Program Review - LaNae Jaimez

Last meeting on the $20^{\rm th}$, template training and individual work sessions are in the works, and three of 17 programs have completed PR early (gold stars to Art History, Comm Studies, and ASL). Admirable work is also being done by all areas of Liberal Arts.

Student Equity and Success Council – Commodore St. Germain

- Meeting weekly in the library with election topics for discussion.
- An Anti-racism statement is almost done.
- A slavery acknowledgement statement is underway and may be added to our land acknowledgement statement.
- The student drop survey is in the works, but there's concern that it may be used inappropriately. Options: outsource the survey and anonymize, create questions that can't be manipulated.
- Union discussions to get adjuncts paid for committee work are underway.

Curriculum/Tech Review - Sarah Barsness

- Common Course Numbering: Curriculum changes are underway in the first phase of CCN; English did significant lifting on their affected courses.
- Spring semester: Sarah is on sabbatical. Jim DeKloe will chair while Sarah is away.
