Final Grades Submission Deadline

The 2017 hiring manual includes a requirement that faculty submit final grades four calendar days after the last class of finals week, evidently with the approval of the Senate at the time. This has proven controversial though, as faculty in certain disciplines believe this limits their ability to be flexible with students struggling to finish and to thoughtfully grade term papers before the deadline. But administration and students also have an interest in quickly getting final grades submitted. We had planned to discuss this complex issue on December 2nd, but after consulting with SCFA President Farmer, we have decided to defer to SCFA, as this seems most clearly union purview as it directly relates to working conditions. We will agendize this in the future at their request.

Hiring Process Update

Three of the 11 hiring committees have been finalized and will be on the next Senate agenda, other committees are still in the works. We want each committee to be as diverse and representative as possible, with five faculty and three students per committee with alternates in place (one in discipline, one out of discipline, one ASSC generalist). While it is easiest (from payroll/HR perspective) to appoint student workers, any student can participate. Please recruit and get the word out to your students. Board Policy Updates - David Williams

Senators reviewed the workgroup's recommended edits/revisions of the Academic Affairs board polices; these will come back to Senate for further discussion/approval at the next and will then move to the Governing Board for finalization.

A cycle of review will be established for these (and all) board policies and procedures.

ECHS Visit & Discussion (30 minutes) Josh Scott, Mr. Pizzo, ECHS Teachers

Principal Pizzo and three ECHS faculty introduced themselves and shared information on the EC program, as well as fielded questions from Senators.

- The ECHS is in its 11th year, with 100~ students per year and waitlists/lottery enrollment.
- Freshmen take one in-person college class initially. They get a sample 4 year plan, and can take a second class after demonstrated success and meeting with their counselor. They have some autonomy for choosing enrollments after requirements are met.
- Students take scaffolded college readiness all four years, building on AVID pedagogy.
- 20% are GATE (gifted & talented), 37% are socially/economically disadvantaged backgrounds
- Students come from 16 different schools, but then become a Rodriguez student for this program on our campus (so they retain HS access to sports, dances, etc)
- Pegasus is their mascot: blending the Rodriguez Mustang with the SCC Falcon
- Foreign languages (Spanish, Sign language, French) are heavy enrollments as there aren't enough FL teachers in the high schools
- 38/94 completed with an AA last year but most had to take summer school to do so
- Dedicated campus monitor helps with behavior issues.
- 96% success rate last year in our classes, 87% were A/B grades
