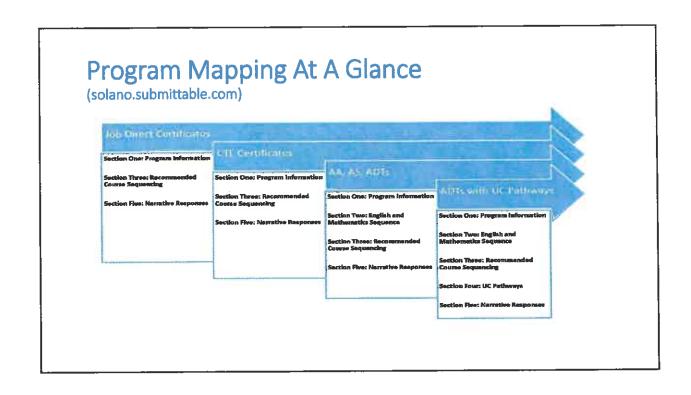

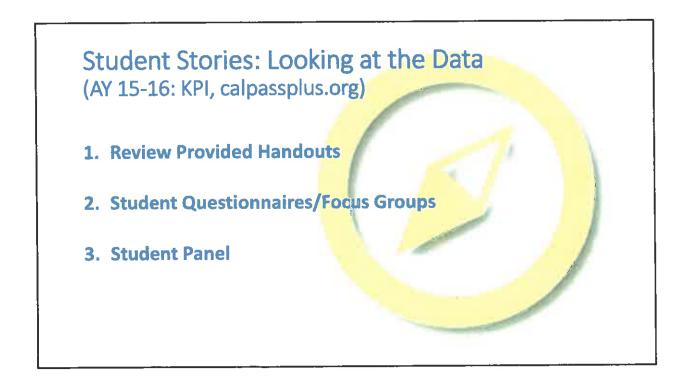

Redesigning and integrating basic skills/developmental education classes to accelerate students to

college-level classes.





Proactive academic and career advising

from the start through completion and/or transfer, with assigned point of contact at each stage.



Structured onboarding processes including

improved placement tests and co-requisite instruction that provide students with clear, actionable, and usable information they need to get off to the right start in college.



Responsive student tracking systems aligned with interventions

and resources to help students stay on the pathway, persist, and progress.
